9	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
10	Section 1. The San Francisco Health Code is hereby amended by repealing Section
11	1607 in its entirety:
12	SEC. 1607. LEAD POISONING PREVENTION CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE.
13	(a) There is hereby established a Lead Poisoning Prevention Citizens Advisory
14	Committee.
15	(b) The committee shall consist of 25 members appointed by the Board of
16	Supervisors as follows:
17	(1) Two representatives with expertise in childcare;
18	(2) Two representatives from tenant organizations;
19	(3) Five representatives with one each from the Department of Social Services, the
20	Housing Authority, the Mayor's Offices of Housing and Child Care, the Recreation and Park
21	Department, and the San Francisco Unified School District;
22	(4) Sixteen representatives, to include one each with expertise in the following:
23	affordable housing, builders, environmental matters, health educators, immigrant services, language
24	specialist, low income advocate, medical provider, neighborhood concerns, nonprofit clinics, parent.
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1	public housing tenants, public interest organizations, real estate, residential multidwellings, and State
2	preschools.
3	If the Committee recommends that additional members be added to the Committee, the
4	Board of Supervisors may appoint additional persons as members, consistent with such
5	recommendation.
6	(c) The purposes of the committee are:
7	(1) To review the progress of the implementation of the provisions of this ordinance
8	and to report annually on the matter to the Board of Supervisors;
9	(2) To recommend to the Board any changes to this Article it deems appropriate;
10	(3) To recommend to the Board of Supervisors the adoption of policies about
11	screening of individuals suffering from elevated exposures to environmental lead and a primary
12	prevention program;
13	(4) To provide advice and assistance to a City department with respect to lead
14	poisoning prevention issues if the department requests such assistance.
15	(d) At the initial meeting of the committee, and yearly, thereafter, the committee
16	members shall select such officers deemed necessary. The committee shall establish rules and
17	regulations for its own organization and procedure and shall meet when necessary as determined by
18	the committee. All meetings shall, except as provided by general law, be open to the public.
19	(e) Members of the committee shall serve without compensation or reimbursement
20	for expenses. In the event a vacancy occurs, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a successor from
21	the same category.
22	(f) The Director shall provide clerical assistance to the Lead Poisoning Prevention
23	Citizens Advisory Committee and to its subcommittees.
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1	(g) Members of the Leaa Poisoning Prevention Citizens Advisory Committee shall
2	be appointed for a term of four years; provided, however, that the 29 members first appointed shall, by
3	lot at the first meeting, classify their terms so that nine shall serve for a term of two years, 10 shall
4	serve for a term of three years, and 10 shall serve for a term of four years. Any additional member
5	appointed to make the total committee membership greater than 29, as provided under Section 1606(b)
6	shall serve for an initial term of two years. Upon reappointment, such additional member shall serve a
7	regular four year term.
