1 2	[Resolution instructing the Department of Environment to complete a nexus study on a local fee for supermarket checkout bags.]
3 4	Resolution instructing the Department of Environment to complete a nexus study in
5	order to identify the relationship between the use of disposable supermarket checkout
6	bags and various costs to the City, and to determine the legality and appropriateness
7	of a local fee on these bags.
8	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has adopted citywide goals of 75%
9 10	landfill diversion by 2010 and zero waste by 2020; and,
11	WHEREAS, The expansive usage of shopping bags and their typical disposal creates an
12	impediment to San Francisco's landfill diversion goals; and,
13	WHEREAS, Plastic bags are difficult to recycle and currently contaminate material that
14	is processed through San Francisco's recycling and composting programs; and,
15	WHEREAS, Shopping bags create significant litter problems in San Francisco's
16	neighborhoods, highlighted by local residents in a series of townhall meetings held by the
17 18	Department of the Environment, and also litter community beaches, sewer systems and the
10	San Francisco Bay; and,
20	WHEREAS, on a global level, the production of shopping bags has significant
21	environmental impacts each year, including the felling of over 10 million trees, use of over 12
22	million barrels of oil, and the deaths of over 100,000 marine animals from plastic
23	entanglement; and

1	WHEREAS, governments in several countries have placed fees on bags, including the
2	Republic of Ireland, which achieved a 90% decrease in shopping bag usage due to the
3	introduction of a bag fee; and
4	WHEREAS, The Commission on the Environment introduced a Resolution on November
5	10, 2004 urging the Mayor and Board of Supervisors to adopt an ordinance requiring a fee on
6	plastic and paper bags in San Francisco supermarkets, and
7	WHEREAS, California State law mandates that fee must directly relate to the activity to
8 9	which it is applied, must be set at a proportional and reasonable level which cannot exceed
10	the cost of addressing problems of the subject activity, must be not levied for unrelated
11	purposes, and must bear a reasonable relationship to the payer's burden or benefit from the
12	regulated activity, and
13	WHEREAS, The Department of the Environment has completed a preliminary analysis of
14	costs incurred by the City due to usage of shopping bags and has suggested a fee of 17 cents
15 16	per bag to cover those costs; and
17	WHEREAS, a broader external nexus study is necessary to definitively determine the
18	relationship between usage of shopping bags and problems identified by the Department of
19	the Environment, to quantify the costs to the City of dealing with problems created by the use
20	of shopping bags, and if appropriate, to determine a fair and reasonable user fee to fund City
21	costs associated with usage of shopping bags; therefore be it
22	RESOLVED, That the Mayor and Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
23 24	Francisco requests the Department of Environment to contract with an independent, external
24	entity to complete a nexus study in order to identify the relationship between the use of

1	disposable supermarket checkout bags and various costs to the City, and to determine the
2	legality and appropriateness of a local fee on these bags; and
3	FURTHER RESOLVED, This study or an additional external study should determine the
4	economic impact of this fee on San Francisco residents, particularly those residents with low
5	or fixed incomes and residents with large families; and
6	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of the Environment should work with the
7 8	Office of the Treasurer, City and County of San Francisco, to determine the cost of collecting
9	and disbursing user fees, which must be included in nexus; and
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Environment is instructed to utilize non-
11	General Fund monies to complete this study; and
12	FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Environment is instructed to complete this
13	study by April 31, 2005; and
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Environment will report in writing to the
15 16	Mayor and Members of the Board of Supervisors on the results of this nexus study
17	immediately upon its completion.
