I have lived in San Francisco as an adult since 1995, but I have lived in the Inner Richmond Since 2007. Since then, I adopted the bicycle as in botter of proper wind soft anapportation around San Francisco, and even to other parts of the Bay Area when combined with public transportation. I have the Richmond District for its proximity to nature - bottering with Golden Gate Park, Land's End, the Presidio and the Pacific Ocean, which makes this neighborhood ideal for cycling. However, despite the Richmond's beauty and reputation as being family focused, it is still very car-centric and therefore very unsafe for people who use non-motorized transportation, especially the most vulnerable members of our district. As a member of the Bicycle Advisory Committee representing District 1, I will prioritize improving the public safety of Richmond residents of all ages, genders, ethnicities, income-levels, abilities and backgrounds. I feel I am uniquely qualified to serve on the BAC for District 1 for many reasons. I am a longlime member of the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition, and an outspoken advocate for safe streets, sustainable Transportation, climate resilience and Vision Zero. I have joined Vision Zero workshops and trainings to be better informed of solutions that will reduce traffic deaths and injuries, while also addressing car congestion, air pollution and climate change risks. As a bicycle filmmaker, I have had the opportunity to publicly present real stories of people who ride bikes in San Francisco to local, regional, national and international audiences. In addition, I'm pursuing a certificate in sustainability from City College of San Francisco. The additions that will reduce traffic deaths and fulfuines, while also addressing car presentations and speaking engagements. As a city, San Francisco cannot be fully committed to achieving climate change goals if we don't make walking and biking safer and more convenient transportation choices for everyone In the past, I have been active in the campaigns to make Arguello, Masonic and 8th Avenue safer for people on bikes and on foot. As the D1 representative for the Bicycle Advisory Committee, I would continue to advocate strongly for safety improvements on these confiders, as well as improving bicycle safety in Golden Gate Park, the 8th Avenue Neighborway, and bike routes outside of D1 that are heavily used by Richmond residents like the Panhandle and The Wiggle. Finally, for the past year, I have had first hand experience using a bicycle for work as a bike courier for various companies. With the increase in popularity of the on-demand delivery economy, more and more vehicles in San Francisco are used to deliver goods or meals to workers and residents, creating jobs for people who need to supplement their income, but creating traffic hazards as well. San Francisco streets are not safe enough to sustain the popularity of the delivery economy. I have first hand knowledge of the issues that couriers face, and also the problems the delivery industry creates. I would endeavor to make our streets safer for blke messengers and encourage the use of fossil fuel free transportation for deliveries rather than greenhouse gas/particulate matter emitting motor vehicles. For these reasons and more, I would like to serve on the Bicycle Advisory Committee for District 1. It would be a pleasure and honor to serve the district where I was born and that I love

The Bicycle Advisory Committee shall consist of a total of 17 members, 11 of whom are voting members. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate one (1) member for appointment by the full Board of Supervisors.

In addition to the 11 voting members, the following City departments will each provide a nonvoting representative to attend Advisory Committee meetings: 1) Police Department, 2) Department of Public Works, 3) Municipal Transportation Agency, and 4) Department of City Planning. The Board of Supervisors also requests that the 1) San Francisco Unified School District and the 2) Golden Gate National Recreation Area each be asked to send a non-voting representative to the Advisory Committee.

This Advisory Committee will be composed of concerned and informed residents and will provide the best single source of expertise and perspective for transportation planners.

The term of each member of the Advisory Committee shall be two years or for the tenure of the supervisor who nominated the member, whichever is shorter in duration.

The Advisory Committee shall have the power and duty to: a) set up subcommittees as necessary; b) develop a plan for bicycle-related improvements, including but not limited to bicycle routes, secure parking, and transit interface, and make recommendations to the
