17	Section 1. The Sa	n Francisco Health Code is hereby amended by adding Section 456.6, to reac
18	as follows:	
19	Sec. 456.6. Enforcement of Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 and its	
20	Implementing Regulations; Requirement That Warnings Be Provided In English, Spanish and Chinese.	
21	(a) The Departmen	nt of Public Health shall enforce the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic
22	Enforcement Act of 1986	(California Health and Safety Code Chapter 6.6 added by Proposition 65
23	1986 General Election) a	nd its implementing regulations (California Code of Regulations, Title 22,
24	Section 12000 et seq.) wit	h respect to foods which are subject to a state or federal Department
25	of Health and Human S	Services, Food and Drug Administration, or Environmental Protection

1	Agency safety advisory where said advisory is regarding a substance included on the
2	Proposition 65 list issued by the State of California Environmental Protection Agency by:
3	(1) Inspecting food product and marketing establishments defined in Section 440 and food
4	preparation and service establishments defined by Section 451 to determine whether these
5	establishments are in compliance with the warning requirements of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic
6	Enforcement Act of 1986 and its implementing regulations with respect to foods which are subject
7	to a state or federal Department of Health and Human Services, Food and Drug
8	Administration, or Environmental Protection Agency safety advisory where said advisory is
9	regarding a substance included on the Proposition 65 list issued by the State of California
10	Environmental Protection Agency;
11	(2) Serving notices requiring the correction of any violation of the Safe Drinking Water and
12	Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 or its implementing regulations with respect to foods which are
13	subject to a state or federal Department of Health and Human Services, Food and Drug
14	Administration, or Environmental Protection Agency safety advisory where said advisory is
15	regarding a substance included on the Proposition 65 list issued by the State of California
16	Environmental Protection Agency; and
17	(3) Calling upon the City Attorney or the District Attorney to maintain an action for violation of
18	the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 or its implementing regulations with
19	respect to foods which are subject to a state or federal Department of Health and Human
20	Services, Food and Drug Administration, or Environmental Protection Agency safety advisory
21	where said advisory is regarding a substance included on the Proposition 65 list issued by the
22	State of California Environmental Protection Agency, to cause correction of such violation, and for
23	assessment and recovery of civil or criminal remedies for such violation.
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1	(b) Written warnings required to be provided by food product and marketing establishments and		
2	food preparation and service establishments under the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Ac		
3	of 1986 and its implementing regulations or any settlements and consent judgments pertaining to		
4	lawsuits filed pursuant to the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 and its		
5	implementing regulations with respect to foods which are subject to a state or federal		
6	Department of Health and Human Services, Food and Drug Administration, or Environmental		
7	Protection Agency safety advisory where said advisory is regarding a substance included on		
8	the Proposition 65 list issued by the State of California Environmental Protection Agency shall		
9	be made in English, Spanish and Chinese. Written warnings in Spanish and Chinese shall comply with		
10	the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 and its implementing regulations and any		
11	settlements and consent judgments pertaining to lawsuits filed pursuant to the Safe Drinking Water and		
12	Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 and its implementing regulations and be provided in the same manner		
13	as the warnings in English, including but not limited to location, size, and font of the warning message.
