

1 [Ordinance reducing FY 2004-2005 General Fund overtime appropriations for public safety  
2 departments by 5 percent and for certain non-safety departments by 10 percent.]

3 **Ordinance directing the Controller to reduce Fiscal Year 2004-2005 General Fund**  
4 **appropriations to specified public safety departments for overtime expenses by 5**  
5 **percent, and to specified non-safety or health departments by 10 percent where the**  
6 **savings would be at least \$5,000.**

10 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

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12 Section 1. The Controller is authorized and directed to reduce General Fund  
13 appropriations for overtime for Fiscal Year 2004-2005 as follows:

14 (1) For public safety departments, a reduction of 5 percent. The affected departments  
15 are: Adult Probation; District Attorney; Emergency Communications; Fire; Juvenile Probation;  
16 Police; Public Defender; and, Sheriff.

17 (2) For departments other than public safety and health, a reduction of 10 percent,  
18 where such reduction would result in at least \$5,000 in cost savings. The affected  
19 departments are, subject to the cost-savings requirement: Academy of Sciences;  
20 Administrative Services; Arts; Assessor; Asian Art Museum; Board of Supervisors; Children,  
21 Youth and Their Families; City Administrator; City Attorney; Civil Service; Contoller; Economic  
22 and Workforce Development; Elections; Environment; Ethics; Fine Arts Museums; Human  
23 Resources; Human Rights; Human Services; Law Library; Library; Mayor; Planning; Public

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1 Works; Recreation and Parks; Retirement; Status of Women; Telecommunications and  
2 Information Systems; and, Treasurer/Tax Collector.
