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3	Resolution Urging the California Assembly and Senate and the Governor of California
4	to support Assembly Bill 799 (AB799), introduced by Assemblymember Mark Leno, the
5	"Local vehicle license fee for San Francisco"
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7	WHEREAS, Local governments bear a majority of the costs created by vehicles,
8	including law enforcement, infrastructure maintenance and public health needs; and,
9	WHEREAS, The revenues collected from the Vehicle License Fee are distributed to
10	local governments to pay for a variety of programs, including public health, human and social
11	services, public safety programs, general administration, law enforcement, planning,
12	infrastructure maintenance and realignment funds; and,
13	WHEREAS, As a major metropolitan area with approximately 440,000 vehicles, the
14	City and County of San Francisco receives a substantial amount of revenue from the Vehicle
15	License Fee; and,
16	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco depend on the stable disbursement
17	of Vehicle License Fee funds from the State of California for effective operation; and,
18	WHEREAS, Revenues generated by The Vehicle Licensing Fee had historically been
19	set at a rate of 2% and dedicated to Cities and Counties but was cut to .67% in 2003; and,
20	WHEREAS, San Francisco's revenue has been further diminished in recent years due
21	to settlements of lawsuits and state preemptions on progressive revenue generation; and,
22	WHEREAS, San Francisco's California State Assemblymember Mark Leno has
23	introduced AB799, which would provide the City and County of San Francisco with
24	authorizing language to introduce a local option for the Vehicle License Fee; and,

1	WHEREAS, The Proposal would remove the preemption for the City and County of
2	San Francisco, which would enable The Board of Supervisors to initiate a process to enact an
3	additional fee of 1.33 percent of the market value of the vehicle beyond the State 0.67
4	percent rate; and,
5	WHEREAS, AB799 would not enact a local Vehicle License Fee but would allow the
6	Board of Supervisors to put the measure to the voters for majority approval; and,
7	WHEREAS, The motorist would be charged a maximum of 2 percent, the same rate
8	charged by the State of California for the Vehicle License Fee from 1948 to 1998; and,
9	WHEREAS, San Francisco is a Transit First City per section 16.102 of the City
10	Charter; and,
11	WHEREAS, This 2 percent Vehicle License fee would generate \$64 million dollars
12	annually for San Francisco; and,
13	WHEREAS, San Mateo County has received a special dispensation for a vehicle
14	license fee and is currently using the revenue to fund traffic related programs; and,
15	WHEREAS, San Francisco is in dire need of new revenues to replenish those which
16	have been made unavailable by other means; now, therefore, be it
17	RESOLVED, That The San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the California
18	Legislature to follow Assemblymember Leno's lead and affirmatively pass AB799; and; be it,
19	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the
20	Governor of the State of California to sign AB799 when it reaches his desk.
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
