11	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending					
12	Section 2A.166, to read as follows:

15		(a)	Establishment of Committee. There is hereby established a San			
16	Francisco Museum and Historical Society Advisory Committee ("Committee").					
17		(b)	Committee Membership. The Committee shall consist of eleven (11)			
	voting memb	ers. T	he members shall consist of:			
18		(1)	Two (2) representatives from the San Francisco Museum and Historical			
19	Society (the "Society");					
20	• `	(2)	Two (2) representatives from the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco			
21	("FAMSF");	()

6	orientation, gender, or any of the various other cultural communities within San Francisco (the			
7	"Historical Organization Representatives");			
8	(6) One (1) member of the public with a professional background in			
9	museums who is not affiliated with FAMSF or the Society (the "Museum Professional			
10	Representative"); and			
11	(7) Two (2) members of the public from organizations or communities with			
12	extensive knowledge of the history or cultural traditions of an ethnic minority community within			
13	San Francisco, with a focus on ancestral lineage or other historical and cultural links to the			
14	San Francisco Bay Area (the "Community Representatives").			
15	The Society representatives shall be appointed by the San Francisco Museum			
16	and Historical Society. The Historical Organization Representatives and one of the			
17	Community Representatives shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors based on			
18	nominations from the Society and from applications submitted bythe general public. The			
19	Museum Professional Representative, the Historical Research Representative and the other			
20	Community Representative shall be appointed by the Mayor based on nominations from the			
21	Society and from applications submitted by the general public. The Society's nominations and			
22	the applications for the Historical Organization Representative and Board-appointed			
23	Community Representative positions shall be submitted to the Clerk of the Board of			

Supervisors within 30 days of the enactment of this Ordinance. The Society's nominations and

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the public representative applications for the Museum Professional Representative, the

2 Historical Research Representative and the Mayor-appointed Community Representative

3 positions shall be submitted to the Mayor's Office within 30 days of the enactment of this

4 Ordinance. The San Francisco Public Library representative shall be appointed by the City

Librarian. The FAMSF representatives shall be appointed by the Director of the Fine Arts

Museums. All appointments shall be made within 60 days after enactment of this Ordinance

and thereafter, as provided in subparagraph (c). Each Committee member shall serve at the

pleasure of the appointing authority.

In making appointments, members of the Board of Supervisors, Mayor, City
Librarian and the Director of the Fine Arts Museums shall take into consideration City policy
that the members of all boards, commissions and committees be broadly representative of the
diversity in ethnicity, race, age and sexual orientation of the City and County and have
representation of both sexes. In no event shall more than five members of the Committee
consist of members of the Fine Arts Museums Board of Trustees ("Fine Arts Museums
Board") or its Executive Committee. In no event shall more than five members of the
Committee consist of board members of the Society.

(c) Term of Office. Members shall serve a term of one year. The first one-year term for all members, other than the Community Representatives, shall begin upon the date the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors certifies that all members of the Committee have been appointed following the adoption of this Ordinance. Future terms of office shall begin on that date of each successive year. Members shall conduct the first meeting of the Committee within thirty days of the appointment of a quorum of the members. The first one-year term for the Community Representatives shall begin upon the date the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors certifies that such representatives have been appointed.

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1	In the event a vacancy in Committee membership occurs, the successor to the		
2	vacant position shall be appointed to complete the unexpired term of the office vacated in the		
3	same manner used to select the previous occupant of that position, consistent with		
4	subparagraph (b).		
5	(d) Removal of Members. Any member whom the Committee certifies to		
6	have missed three regularly scheduled meetings of the Committee in any six month period		
7	without prior authorization of the Committee shall be deemed to have resigned from the		
8	Committee effective on the date of the written certification from the Committee.		
9	(e) Compensation. Members of the Committee shall not be compensated,		
10	nor shall they be reimbursed for expenses.		
11	(f) Purposes and Duties of Committee. The purposes and duties of the		
12	Committee are to publicly discuss and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors,		
13	Fine Arts Museums Board and San Francisco Museum and Historical Society regarding any		
14	or all of the following topics:		
15	(1) The management of the City history collections of the San Francisco		
16	Museum and Historical Society, the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco, the San Francisco		
17	Public Library and other City departments, (the "Collection") including, but not limited to,		
18	issues related to the inventory, housing, storage, exhibition, conservation and development of		
19	such Collection;		
20	(2) The type of relationship between the City and the Society that would best		
21	serve to ensure the continuing existence, financial stability and success of the San Francisco		
22	Museum and Historical Society;		
23	(3) The identification of permanent exhibition venue(s) for the Society's		
24	Collection and funding for such venue(s);		

1	(4)	Sources of potential financial support for the Society,	
2	(5)	The potential creation of one or more full-time or part-time positions under	
3	the Fine Arts Muser	ums' budget for the purpose of conducting a complete inventory/catalogue	
4	of the City and Cou	nty of San Francisco's historical collections as well as those of the Society;	
5	(6)	The potential merger of the City's historical collections with the Society's	
6	Collection; and		
7	(7)	Strategies to promote citywide communication and partnership between	
8	various local organizations that hold historical/cultural resources.		
9	(g)	Reporting Requirements. The Committee shall submit to the Board of	
10	Supervisors, the Fir	ne Arts Museums Board and San Francisco Museum and Historical	
11	Society an initial wr	itten report, by March 31 of 2003, summarizing its preliminary findings and	
12	recommendations,	and then submit a detailed annual report by March 1 of each subsequent	
13	year the Committee	e is in operation.	
14	(h)	Officers. At the initial meeting of the Committee, the Committee	
15	members shall select such officers as it deems necessary.		
16	(i)	Staff Support. The Fine Arts Museums shall provide <u>and/or oversee</u> staff	
17	support and resource	ces for the Committee.	
18	(j)	Meetings. The Committee shall meet at least bi-monthly. All meetings of	
19	the Committee, exc	ept as provided by applicable laws, shall be open to the public.	
20	(k)	Establishment of Rules and Regulations. The Committee, which qualifies	
21	as a Policy Body ur	nder San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 67 (the "Sunshine	
22	Ordinance"), shall e	establish rules and regulations for its own organization and procedure that	
23	are consistent with	the Sunshine Ordinance and other laws governing the conduct of public	

meetings.

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1	(I) Sunset Clause. The provisions of this Ordinance and the operation of the						
2	Committee shall expire on June 1, 2005 2006, unless otherwise amended by the Board of						
3	Supervisors.
