15	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
16	Section 1. The San Francisco Health Code is hereby amended by amending Section		
17	128.1, to read as follows:

(b) Beginning with Fiscal Year 2004-2005-2005-2006, the fees set in this section may be
amended without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes in the Medical
Consumer Price Index as determined by the Controller. No later than April 15th of each year,
the Fire Department shall submit its current fee schedule to the Controller, who shall apply the
price index adjustment to produce a new fee schedule for the following year.
(c) The San Francisco Fire Department may from time to time change or add medications and
supplies used by emergency medical services according to the Advanced Life Support Scope of
Practice under Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations. With the approval of the Controller, the
Department may set the fees for those additional items based on the usual and customary industry
standards.
(d) (c) No later than May 15th of each year, the Controller shall file a report with the
Board of Supervisors reporting the new fee schedule and certifying that: (a) the fees produce
sufficient revenue to support the costs of providing the services for which each fee is
assessed, and (b) the fees do not produce revenue which is significantly more than the costs
of providing the services for which each fee is assessed.
Section 2. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in
this Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California
Public Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.) . Said determination is on file with the Clerk
of the Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by
reference.
