3	Ordinance amending Sections 106.8, 106.9, 106.11, 106.15, 106. 17, and Table 106B of			
4	the San Francisco Fire Code to increase the San Francisco Fire Department's fees for			
5	high rise inspection, plan review, pre-application plan review, overtime, and water flow			
6	requests, to become operative on its effective date or on July 1, 2005 whichever is			
7	later, and making environmental findings.

11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:			
12	Section 1. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Section			
13	106.8 to read as follows:			
14	106.8 [For SF] High-Rise Inspection Fees. For inspections of high-rise structures			
15	pursuant to Section 13217 of the California Health and Safety Code, the owner of the			
16	structure shall pay a fee to cover the department's costs of inspection. Such fee shall be			
17	calculated on the basis of $\frac{\$7.48}{\$8.00}$ per 1000 square feet of gross floor area, and shall be			
18	collected by the fire department.			
19	Section 2. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Section			
20	106.9 to read as follows:			
21	106.9 [For SF] Plan Review Fees. Upon application for a permit for the erection of a			
22	new building or for alteration work for which plans are required by the department of building			
23	inspection, the central permit bureau shall charge and collect a fee to compensate the fire			
24	department for its costs of reviewing plans submitted with building permit applications for			
25	compliance with fire safety regulations. The fee shall be based on the valuation of the work as			

determined by the department of building inspection. The fee for each permit shall be as set
 forth in Table 106-B. The fire department shall collect a fee in the amount of *\$75.00 §80.00* per
 hour or fraction thereof for any back checking review of previously approved plans.

Section 3. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Section
106.11 to read as follows:

6 106.11 [For SF] Pre-application plan review. When a party wishes to discuss specific 7 design issues or submit preliminary designs for review and comment by the Fire Department 8 prior to formal application for permit, a fee of *\$150.00 §160.00* will be assessed. This fee will 9 provide the applicant with up to two hours for research and meeting with Fire Department 10 personnel.

Section 4. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Section
106.15 to read as follows:

13 106.15 [For SF] Overtime Fee. Upon a request from a person or firm for an inspection
 which is not scheduled during an employees normal working schedule, an overtime fee will be
 charged. An overtime fee of \$90.00 \$95.00 per hour shall be collected. The minimum
 compensation will be four hours.

Section 5. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Section
106.17 to read as follows:

19 106.17 [For SF] Water Flow Request Fee. Upon a request from a person or firm for
20 water flow information, a water flow fee of *\$37.50 §40.00* will be charged. If the information
21 requested requires that Fire Department employees are required to perform an on-site water
22 flow test, a fee of *\$150.00 §160.00* will be charged.

Section 6. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Table 106-B
to read as follows:
