4	PUC capital improvements for the Water System Improvement Program shall be budgeted
5	and approved by project, and may be defined based on regional or functional improvements,
6	and may contain sub-projects to further define components of capital improvements.
7	Appropriations to capital improvements shall be monitored and controlled by the Controller at
8	the project level. The PUC is authorized to transfer funds within sub-projects with approval of
9	the Controller. The Controller is authorized to transfer funding from existing water
10	improvement projects into the Water System Improvement Program. The Controller shall
11	report to the Board of Supervisors quarterly on any transfers of appropriation authority
12	between PUC projects or sub-projects which would increase the total appropriation of the
13	receiving project or allocated appropriation of the receiving sub-project by more than 10%.

15	San Joaquin Pipeline System
16	Expenditures for the San Joaquin Pipeline System project during fiscal year 2005-2006 and
17	the first six-months of fiscal year 2006-07 shall only be for the following: (1) Alternative
18	analysis, including developing a water supply alternative for the Program Environmental
19	Impact Report (PEIR) that meets the estimated increase in level of purchase from the SFPUC
20	by year 2030 from sustainable sources such as renewal groundwater, recycling and
21	conservation and not from the Tuolumne River or other surface water sources; (2) General
22	environmental analysis; and, (3) Developing a policy based on scientific studies regarding
23	Tuolumne river and other water releases to improve the natural habitat.

2	Funds from this appropriation will not be allocated to the Alameda Creek Fishery			
3	Enhancement project. Any existing funds previously appropriated shall not be used for further
