3	Resolution urging California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger to sign AB 378 (Chu),
4	the Hate Crime Civil Remedies Act into law.
5	
6	WHEREAS, AB 378 (Chu) is inspired by the case of five Asian youth who were
7	attacked and beaten by up to twenty white male teens in June of 2003; and,
8	WHERAS, initially the five boys were accosted by three white males shouting "chink"
9	"gook", and other racial epithets; and,
10	WHEREAS, soon the rest of the group joined, beating and kicking the five boys
11	repeatedly; and,
12	WHEREAS, when the boys attempted to escape across the street, they were followed
13	and beaten again; and
14	WHEREAS, the incident ended only when law enforcement officials arrived on the
15	scene; and,
16	WHEREAS, of the twenty attackers, only one was arrested and charged immediately
17	and,
18	WHEREAS, the other perpetrators were identified at trial over one year after the
19	underlying incident; and,
20	WHEREAS, as a result, the five boys lost the opportunity to bring a meaningful civi
21	action against the vast majority of their attackers; and,
22	WHEREAS, the Bane Act allows hate crime victims to seek a \$25,000 penalty agains
23	their attackers but hate crime victims must bring the civil action within one year of the
24	underlying incident to seek this penalty; and,

1	WHEREAS, for many hate crime victims, bringing a civil action within one year is not
2	advisable or even possible; and,
3	WHEREAS, criminal proceedings involving hate crimes can often take well over one
4	year, and a civil proceeding may seriously hinder the criminal prosecution; and,
5	WHEREAS, just as significant, the attackers may not be identified until after the one
6	year period has expired; and,
7	WHEREAS, AB 378 (Chu), which would allow hate crime victims a fair opportunity to
8	seek justice and meaningful redress from their attackers; and,
9	WHEREAS, AB 378 (Chu) would extend the statute of limitations to three years for
10	hate crime victims to recover monetary penalties under the Bane Act; now, therefore, be it
11	RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors hereby urges California Governor Arnold
12	Schwarzenegger to sign AB 378 (Chu), the Hate Crime Civil Remedies Act into law.
