7	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has through local policy and
8	ordinance historically shown its consistent commitment to fair and equitable treatment of all
10	persons regardless of gender or sexual orientation; and
11	WHEREAS, Mayor Gavin Newsom sanctioned same sex marriages on February 10 th ,
12	2004 in the City and County of San Francisco; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is home to numerous families
15	headed by same gender couples, many with children; and
16	WHEREAS, Assemblyman Mark Leno introduced Bill AB849 to amend current state
17	law regarding marriage to a civil union between two persons rather than a civil union between
18	a man and a woman; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, California state legislature passed AB849 by a vote of 41-35 on
21	September 6 th , 2005; and
22	WHEREAS, Both the United States Constitution and California Constitution clearly
23	state that no laws will be made or enforced that abridge the privileges and immunities of
2425	citizens of the United States; and that no person within its jurisdiction will be denied equal
20	protection of the laws; and

2	WHEREAS, The United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights guarantees the
3	right to marry and found a family to "all men and women of full age"; and
4	WHEREAS, California law currently provides domestic partners with only some of the
5	state rights available to married couples; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, Independent studies prove that California would save \$25 million dollars a
8	year in tax revenue if same gender couples were allowed to marry, and
9	WHEREAS, Providing equal access to civil marriage will not require religious
10	institutions to perform or recognize marriages that conflict with their particular religious
11	traditions or beliefs; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, The opportunity to publicly and legally commit to share one's life with a
14	person of one's choice is for many people one of the most central aspects of human
15	experience; and the denial of marriage to same sex couples is a denial of fundamental human
16	rights; and
17	WHEREAS, Denying civil marriage to gay and lesbian families deprives them of
18	thousands of state and federal rights, privileges, immunities, protections, and responsibilities;

20	WHEREAS, In February 2004, Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court ruled in
21	"Goodridge V. Department of Public Health" that the government may no longer deny
22	marriage and marriage rights to same sex couples because it is unconstitutional under the
23	liberty and equality provisions of the Massachusetts Constitution, and

1	WHEREAS, In 2005, Canada and three other west European nations including Spain
2	Belgium, the Netherlands have taken a leadership role in securing civil rights for gay
	individuals by legalizing same-sex marriage; and,
3	
4	WHEREAS, Gay and lesbian families deserve the same rights and legal protections as
5	other families under the law, including the protection of their spousal rights and privileges and
6	protection of their children's economic interests by insuring their access to the resources of
7	both parents; and

9	WHEREAS, Suffering the inability to access these legal protections results in
10	significant harm to these families, including financial insecurity, lack of retirement and death benefits; and lack of access to family court for dissolution; and
11	benefits, and lack of access to family count for dissolution, and
12	WHEREAS, No resident of the City and County of San Francisco should be refused
	equal protection under the law; and

14	WHEREAS, Discriminatory civil marriage laws result, especially, in significant harm to
15	lesbian, gay, bisexual; and transgendered people by perpetuating homophobia, just as anti-
16	miscegenation laws barring people of different races from marrying, legal in the United States
17	until 1967, perpetuated racism and social ostracism; now, therefore be it
18	
19	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
20	declares its support for eliminating legal discrimination against same-sex couples in the
21	provision of civil marriage licenses and supports The Religious Freedom And Civil Marriage
22	Protection Act, AB849; and be it
23	FURTHER RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the
24	Governor of California, Arnold Schwarzenegger to sign The Religious Freedom and Civil
25	Marriage Protection Act thus protecting all families of California.
