3	Resolution declaring October 2005 to be "Domestic Violence Awareness Month" in the
4	City and County of San Francisco.

6	WHEREAS, violence against women and girls in contemporary United States society is
7	pervasive, and all women and girls are potential targets of violence regardless of whether they
8	are rich or poor, disabled or able-bodied, heterosexual or lesbian, of a particular age, or a
9	member of a particular ethnic, cultural or religious group; and,
10	WHEREAS, domestic violence in America is intolerable and must be stopped; and,
11	WHEREAS, domestic violence is a problem of epidemic proportions in our country and
12	community; and,
13	WHEREAS, according to the 2000 National Crime Victimization Survey, almos
14	700,000 incidents of violence between partners were documented in our Nation, and
15	thousands more go unreported; and,
16	WHEREAS, domestic violence has been defined to include physical, emotional, sexual
17	psychological, and/or financial abuse or control; and,
18	WHEREAS, Children who witness domestic violence often grow up believing that
19	physical cruelty in relationships is acceptable behavior, and thus they may tend to perpetuate
20	a cycle of violence in society; and,
21	WHEREAS, Domestic Violence Awareness Month evolved from the first Day of Unity
22	observed in October 1981 by the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence; and,
23	WHEREAS, in October 1987 the first Domestic Violence Awareness Month was
24	observed; and,

1	WHEREAS, in 1989 the first Domestic Violence Awareness Month Commemorative
2	Legislation was passed by the United States Congress; now, therefore, be it
3	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors declares October 2005 to be "Domestic
4	Violence Awareness Month " in the City and County of San Francisco.
