15 16	Section 1. The Sa	an Francisco Health Code is hereby amended by amending Section
17	3204 to read as follows:	
18	SEC. 3204. APPLICATI	ION FOR MEDICAL CANNABIS DISPENSARY PERMIT.
19	(a) Every applica	nt for a medical cannabis dispensary permit shall file an application
20	with the Director upon a	form provided by the Director and pay a non-refundable permit
21	application fee of \$6110	6691.00 to cover the costs to all City departments of investigating and
22	processing the application	on and any applicable surcharges, exclusive of filing fees for appeals
23	before the Board of Appe	eals. Beginning with fiscal year 2006-2007, the application fee may be
24	adjusted each year, withou	t further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes in the
25	relevant Consumer Price In	ndex, as determined by the Controller. No later than April 15th of each

1	year, the Health Department shall, in collaboration with the Tax Collector's Office, submit the
2	application fee to the Controller, who shall apply the price index adjustment to produce a new
3	application fee for the following year. No later than May 15th of each year, the Controller shall file a
4	report with the Board of Supervisors reporting the new application fee and certifying that: (a) the
5	application fee produces sufficient revenue to support the costs of providing the services for which the
6	annual fee is being charged and (b) the application fee does not produce revenue that exceeds the costs
7	of providing the services for which the application fee is charged. Notwithstanding the procedures set
8	forth in this Section, the Board of Supervisors, in its discretion, may modify the application fee by
9	ordinance at any time.

Section 2. The San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code is hereby amended by amending Section 249.17 to read as follows:

SEC. 249.17. MEDICAL CANNABIS DISPENSARY LICENSE FEE.

Every person, firm or corporation engaged in operating a medical cannabis dispensary shall pay an annual license fee of \$ 3,100.00 to the Tax Collector to cover the costs of annual inspections, enforcement and other costs to the City. Beginning with fiscal year 2006-2007, the annual license fee may be adjusted each year, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes in the relevant Consumer Price Index, as determined by the Controller. No later than April 15th of each year, the Tax Collector shall submit the annual license fee to the Controller, who shall apply the price index adjustment to produce a new annual license fee for the following year. No later than May 15th of each year, the Controller shall file a report with the Board of Supervisors reporting the new annual license fee and certifying that: (a) the annual license fee produces sufficient revenue to support the costs of providing the services for which the annual fee is being charged and (b) the annual license fee does not produce revenue that exceeds the costs of providing the services for

1	which the annual license fee is charged. Notwithstanding the procedures set forth in this Section, the		
2	Board of Supervisors, in its discretion, may modify the annual license fee by ordinance at any time.
