3	Ordinance amending the San Francisco Administrative Code, by amending Section			
4	2A.200, to re-name the "Department of Emergency Communications" as the			
5	"Department of Emergency Management," establish Divisions of Emergency			
6	Communications and of Emergency Services and Homeland Security within the			
7	Department, and set qualifications for the Director and Deputy Directors, and by			
8	amending Section 7.7, to substitute the Director of the Department of Emergency			
9	Management for the Director of Emergency Services.

13	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:			
14	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending			
15	Section 2A.200, to read as follows:			
16	SEC. 2A.200. DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY <u>MANAGEMENT</u> COMMUNICATIONS.			
17	(a) Department of Emergency Management Communications; Director. There is			
18	hereby created a Department of Emergency Management Communications. The Mayor shall			
19	appoint a Director of of the Department of Emergency Management Communications who shall			
20	serve as department head and appointing officer for the Department. <u>The Director, at the time</u>			
21	of appointment, must have a total of at least ten years of employment, experience, or professional			
22	service in any of the following fields: firefighting, law enforcement, public health, or military service,			
23	or in the fields of disaster management or emergency preparedness and relief at the local, state, or			
24	federal level. At least five years of that employment, experience or professional service shall be at a			
25	management level. The Director shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and shall report directly			

to the Mayor. The Department shall include such officers and employees as are authorized
 pursuant to the budgetary and fiscal provisions of the Charter.

- 3 (b) Divisions. The Department shall include two divisions: (i) Emergency Communications
  4 and (ii) Emergency Services and Homeland Security, each headed by a deputy director appointed by
  5 the Director of the Department of Emergency Management, with each Deputy Director reporting
- 6 <u>directly to the Director.</u>
- 7 (b) Construction Phase. The Director of Emergency Communications shall be the Project 8 Director for the E-911 Project and shall be responsible for constructing and equipping the City and 9 County's Combined Emergency Communications Center and related systems (also referred to as "the 10 911 communications system facility"). The Director may appoint a deputy Department head to plan the 11 operations of the Combined Emergency Communications Center and related systems. The Director 12 shall certify the completion of the Center and related systems to the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors, 13 the Chief of Police, the Fire Chief and the Director of the Department of Public Health. 14 (c) Emergency Communications Operations Phase. Upon its completion, the Director of 15 *Emergency Communications* The Emergency Communications division of the Department shall 16 manage the Combined Emergency Communications Center and related systems, and shall 17 direct all operations related to taking calls from members of the public seeking emergency 18 police, fire and medical assistance and related to the dispatch of emergency police, fire and 19 medical services. The <u>Deputy</u> Director <u>of the Department of Emergency Management for Emergency</u> *Communications* shall have *experience* in the field of emergency communications, including 20 21 experience at a management level in a large municipal, county or military communications center, 22 *including* sufficient professional training and/or experience to manage the operations of the 23 Combined Emergency Communications Center and related systems.
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1	(d) Emergency Services and Homeland Security. The Emergency Services and Homeland				
2	Security division of the Department shall be responsible for supporting and overseeing the Emergency				
3	Services of San Francisco, as further provided in Chapter 7 of this Code. The Deputy Director for of				
4	the Department of Emergency Management for Emergency Services and Homeland Security shall have				
5	experience in the field of emergency preparedness and relief, preferably at a management level.				
6	(d) <b>Transfer of Functions</b> . All City and County programs and staff related to emergency				
7	services call taking and dispatch shall be transferred to the Department of Emergency				
8	Communications. The duties imposed on the Director of Emergency Communications by Subsection (c)				
9	and the transfer of programs and staff to the Department of Emergency Communications shall be				
10	effective upon the date the Director certifies the completion of the E-911 Project pursuant to Subsection				
11	<del>(b).</del>				
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13	Section 2. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending				
14	Section 7.7, to read as follows:				
15	SEC. 7.7. THE EMERGENCY SERVICES OF SAN FRANCISCO – DIRECTOR; POWERS				
16	AND DUTIES.				
17	There is hereby created the office of Director of Emergency Services, who shall be appointed by				
18	the Mayor. The Mayor, as chair of the Disaster Council and Commander of Emergency Services, shall				
19	employ a Director of Emergency Services, who shall have the expert qualifications for the work of				
20	emergency preparedness and relief and whose duty it shall be, The Director of the Department of				
21	Emergency Management under Administrative Code Section 2A.200, subject to the general				
22	supervision of the Mayor and with the assistance of officers in charge of the Emergency				
23	Services, to shall develop and manage an emergency plan of the City and County, to				
24	coordinate all protective and relief services for the City and County, train the training of all				
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personnel connected therewith, and *direct* the operation and implementation of all emergency 1 2 plans and activities. As far as the Disaster Council and the Emergency Services and this work is 3 concerned, the Director shall be subordinate only to the Mayor and he He or she shall work in close 4 cooperation with the Disaster Council and with the heads of the several departments of the municipal government and the officers in charge of the Emergency Services. Under the 5 general supervision of the Mayor, the Director shall maintain the necessary contacts with the 6 7 State Emergency Council and the several local disaster councils within this metropolitan area, 8 in order that coordination of the work of the Disaster Council with the State Emergency 9 Council and other disaster councils may be had. The Director shall serve as the Executive 10 Secretary of the City and County Disaster Council and shall have such other powers and 11 duties as may be assigned by the Mayor. The compensation of the Director shall be fixed in 12 accordance with the fiscal and budgetary provisions of the Charter.

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Section 3. At 12:00 noon on the effective date of this ordinance, the tenures of the persons then holding the positions of Director of Emergency Communications and Director of Emergency Services shall expire. At that time, the Mayor shall appoint a Director of the Department of Emergency Management, and the Director of the Department of Emergency Management thereafter shall appoint a Deputy Director of Emergency Management for Emergency Communications and a Deputy Director of Emergency Management for Emergency Services and Homeland Security.
