3	Resolution authorizing the Municipal Transportation Agency to accept and expend a	
4	grant of \$90,000 in federal funds from the Metropolitan Transportation Commission to	
5	model and retime traffic signals along Market Street and King St./The Embarcadero.	
6		
7	WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Transportation Commission ("MTC") has determined that	
8	proactively retiming traffic signals every three to five years would benefit the Bay Area through	
9	improved mobility, safety, and air quality; and,	
10	WHEREAS, MTC has created the Regional Signal Timing Program ("RSTP") to obtain	
11	those benefits with federal funding from the Federal Highway Administration of the U.S.	
12	Department of Transportation; and,	
13	WHEREAS, In December 2005, the MTC invited Bay Area cities to apply for grants to	
14	retime traffic signals within their jurisdictions; and,	
15	WHEREAS, The Municipal Transportation Agency applied for, and was awarded, an	
16	RSTP grant in the amount of \$90,000 to retime and provide transit or light rail priority for 33	
17	signalized intersections along Market Street between Castro Street and Spear Street, and 27	
18	signalized intersections along King Street between The Embarcadero and North Point and	
19	The Embarcadero between 5 th Street and King Street ("the Project"); and,	
20	WHEREAS, Under the grant, MTC will also provide consultant services to the MTA	
21	Planning Division to help in modeling and retiming the subject traffic signals, which consultant	
22	will indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City/MTA should any of its activities result in	
23	injuries or claims; and	
24	WHEREAS, On April 18, 2006, the MTA Board of Directors adopted Resolution No. 06-	
25	038, which authorized the acceptance and expenditure of a grant in the amount of \$90,000	

from MTC and commended this matter to the Board of Supervisors for its approval; now,
therefore, be it

3	RESOLVED, That on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, the MTA is		
4	authorized to accept and expend \$90,000 in federal funds from MTC to model and retime		
5	traffic signals along Market Street and King St./The Embarcadero; and, be it		
6	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the MTA is authorized to furnish whatever additional		
7	information or assurances may be requested by the funding agencies in connection with this		
8	request; and, be it		
9	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the MTA is authorized to execute any and all agreements		
10	necessary to complete transfer of the funds.
