3	Resolution supporting California State Proposition 1A, the Transportation Funding
4	Protection Legislative Constitutional Amendment.

6	WHEREAS, Proposition 42 was passed by California voters in March 2002; and,
7	WHEREAS, Proposition 42 dedicates the state sales tax on gasoline to transportation
8	purposes, including the Public Transportation Account, the State Transportation Improvement
9	Program (STIP), specified Traffic Congestion Relief Program projects, and local street and
10	road maintenance; and,
11	WHEREAS, Under current law the state can suspend Proposition 42 when the state
12	faces fiscal difficulties; and,
13	WHEREAS, The state suspended Proposition 42 partially in Fiscal Year 2003-04 and
14	completely in Fiscal Year 2004-05; and,
15	WHEREAS, Under Proposition 1A, the state would still be allowed to suspend
16	Proposition 42, but only under stringent conditions, and only twice in any 10-year period; and,
17	WHEREAS, Under Proposition 1A, any borrowing from state gasoline tax revenue for a
18	purpose other than transportation will have to be paid back to transportation projects, with
19	interest; and,
20	WHEREAS, State gasoline tax revenue, which is approximately \$2 billion per year,
21	should be a stable funding source for transportation projects, road improvements and public
22	transit; now therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors endorses the passage on the November 7
24	2006, statewide General Election ballot of Proposition 1A, the Transportation Funding
25	Protection Legislative Constitutional Amendment.
