9	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
10	Section 1. Findings. (a) The Board of Supervisors recognizes that its findings in
11	Section 1(a)-(h) of Ordinance No. 214-05 related to conversion of tourist hotel rooms to
12	condominiums remain valid and hereby readopts said findings as part of this Ordinance. A
13	copy of said Ordinance is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 051333
14	and is incorporated herein by reference.
15	(b) Due to continuing social, economic, and public policy concerns associated with the
16	conversion of tourist hotel rooms to market-rate condominiums, the Board of Supervisors finds
17	that there is a need to continue application of the Tourist Hotel Conversion Ordinance for an
18	additional 6 months.
19	(c) Environmental Findings. The Planning Department has determined that the actions
20	contemplated in this Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality
21	Act (California Public Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file
22	with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. and is incorporated herein by
23	reference.
24	Section 2. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending
25	Section 41F.5, to read as follows:
