11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:				
12	Section 1. Findings.				
13	(a) For the purpose of distributing of federal Homeland Security Grant Funds ("UASI				
14	Program") to the San Francisco Bay Area for fiscal year 2006, the United States Department				
15	of Homeland Security combined a number of jurisdictions in the Bay Area into one Urban Area				
16	Security Initiative Region ("Super-UASI Region"). The federal funds granted to the Super-				
17	UASI Region are administered by the State of California through its UASI Program.				
18	(b) Based on instructions from the Office of Grants and Training for the Department of				
19	Homeland Security, each Urban Area was required to establish an Urban Area Working				
20	Group ("UAWG") to act as an executive steering committee to provide overall governance of				
21	the homeland security program in the Urban Area. State and federal officials have				
22	determined that the City and County of San Francisco, the City of Oakland, the City of San				
23	Jose, Alameda County, and Santa Clara County shall constitute the UAWG for the Bay Area				
24	Super-UASI Region.

1	(c) The UAWG for the Bay Area's Super-UASI Region has determined that
2	San Francisco shall be the primary grantee and fiscal agent for the distribution of UASI
3	program funds for fiscal year 2006. As primary grantee, San Francisco will receive
4	\$22,656,000 million in fiscal year 2006 homeland security funds for distribution throughout the
5	Super-UASI Region.
6	(d) The City and County of San Francisco has participated in the federal homeland
7	security programs since their inception and deems participation in these programs as vital to
8	the continued well being of its citizens, and now, therefore, be it
9	Section 2. Authorization to Accept and Expend Grant Funds.
10	The Department of Emergency Management is hereby authorized to accept and
11	expend on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco \$22,656,000 in funds from the
12	United States Department of Homeland Security through the California Office of Homeland
13	Security under the Urban Area Security Initiatives Program. The Department of Emergency
14	Management is further authorized to furnish whatever additional information or assurances
15	the funding agencies may request in connection with this grant, and to execute any and all
16	agreements necessary to complete transfer of the funds.
17	Section 3. Grant-Funded Positions; Amendments to Annual Salary Ordinance.
18	The positions that will be funded from the fiscal year 2006 grant funds received by the
19	City under the Urban Area Security Initiatives Program are set forth in Ordinance No,
20	which amends Ordinance No. 203-06 (Annual Salary Ordinance 2006/2007), to extend the
21	duration of twenty-nine existing positions at the following departments: Department of
22	Emergency Management, Emergency Services Division (DEM), Police (POL), Fire (FIR),
23	Department of Public Health (DPH), and Sheriff (SHF). The fiscal year 2006 grant funds
24	received by the City under the Urban Area Security Initiatives Program will fund the following

job classifications and FTEs as extended under the amendment to the Annual Salary
