

1 [Accept-Expend Federal Pass Through Grant]

3 **Resolution authorizing the Department of Emergency Management, Emergency**
4 **Services Division, to accept and expend a Federal pass through grant in the amount of**
5 **\$776,000 from the Governor's Office of Homeland Security for the Buffer Zone**
6 **Protection Program.**

8 WHEREAS, In 2005, the Governor's Office of Homeland Security received approval
9 from the Office of State and Local Government Coordination and Preparedness for funding
10 under the FY 2005 Buffer Zone Protection Program (BZPP); and,

11 WHEREAS, The BZPP grant is designated to fund costs related to equipment,
12 management, and administration of protective actions aimed at protecting, securing, and
13 reducing the vulnerabilities of identified critical infrastructure and key resource sites; and,

14 WHEREAS, This program will support state and national homeland security efforts by
15 enhancing the coordination of federal, state, and local efforts to develop and implement
16 protective actions at these critical infrastructure and key resource sites throughout the state;
17 and,

18 WHEREAS, These activities will better safeguard California from terrorist attacks; and,

19 WHEREAS, Funds received must be expended no later than March 31, 2007; and,

20 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment; and,

21 WHEREAS, The grant does not include any provisions for indirect costs, indirect costs
22 are requested to be waived; now, therefore, be it

23 RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes the
24 Department of Emergency Management, Emergency Services Division, to accept and expend
25 a Federal Pass Through Grant in the amount of \$776,000 from the Governor's Office of

1 Homeland Security for the Buffer Zone Protection Program.
