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3 **Resolution declaring the results of the November 7, 2006 Consolidated General**
4 **Election.**

5 WHEREAS, A Consolidated General Election was conducted in the City and County of
6 San Francisco on Tuesday, November 7, 2006, which placed before the electorate candidates
7 for Assessor-Recorder, Public Defender, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, the
