13	Section 1. The San Francisco Traffic Code is hereby amended by amending Section		
14	13, to read as follows:		
15	SEC. 13. DEPARTMENT MEMBERS AS PUBLIC OFFICERS.		
16	The classes of officers or employees of the City and County of San Francisco set forth		
17	below shall have the duty of enforcing those provisions of State law or the San Francisco		
18	Municipal Code which relate to non-moving traffic violations affecting operations of the		
19	municipal railway including, but not limited to, the citation, removal and relocation of a vehicle		
20	parked in a bus zone, the citation, removal and relocation of a vehicle parked upon any		
21	railroad track or within 71/2 feet of the nearest rail, the citation, removal and relocation of a		
22	vehicle left abandoned on property under the jurisdiction of the Public Utilities		
23	CommissionMunicipal Transportation Agency, and the citation, removal and relocation of a		
24	vehicle left standing upon a highway in such a position as to obstruct the normal movement of		
25	traffic or to create a hazard.

20	In the performance	e of their duties the classes of officers and employees listed	
21	above shall have the power, authority and immunity of a public officer and employee, as set		
22	forth in California Penal Code Section 836.5, to make arrests without a warrant whenever		
23	such employees have reasonable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has		
24	committed a misdemeanor in his presence which is a violation of a statute or ordinance which		

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the officer or employee has the duty to enforce. In any case in which a person is arrested
pursuant to this authority and the person arrested does not demand to be taken before a
magistrate, the public officer or employee making the arrest shall prepare a written notice to
appear and shall release the person on his or her promise to appear as prescribed by Chapter
5C (commencing with Section 853.6) of the California Penal Code.

6 Section 2. The San Francisco Traffic Code is hereby amended by amending Section
7 32.1.10, to read as follows:

8 SEC. 32.1.10. PARKING CONTROL, PORTIONS OF WASHINGTON, MASON AND 9 JACKSON STREETS.

10 No person shall stop, park, or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or 11 unattended, at any time, on both sides of Washington Street from Mason Street to a point 210 12 feet westerly, south side of Jackson Street from Mason to a point 210 feet westerly, and the 13 west side of Mason Street from Jackson to Washington, except an officer or employee of the 14 City and County of San Francisco having a permit therefor issued by the San Francisco Public 15 Utilities Commission Municipal Transportation Agency and during the conduct of such officer or 16 employee of the business of the City and County. Said Public Utilities Commission The Municipal 17 Transportation Agency shall have authority to designate areas where various permittees shall 18 be entitled to park or leave vehicles and no vehicles shall be parked or left in any area other 19 than as so designated. Section 3. The San Francisco Public Works Code is hereby amended by amending 20 21 Section 250.242, to read as follows:

22 SEC. 250.242. ANNUAL REPORT.

23 When any part of the operative cost of parking places is to be paid by a special levy,

the San Francisco Parking Authority shall annually file with the Clerk a written report stating in

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reasonable detail the estimated cost of maintenance and operation for which an assessment 1 2 is to be levied in that year, including the cost of replacements, improvements and extensions 3 to any parking place. When part of the operation costs of transit are to be so paid, such report 4 shall be prepared and filed by the *Public Utilities CommissionMunicipal Transportation Agency*. 5 The report shall also state the manner of apportioning the levy to be made therefor. When such report shall have been primarily approved by the Board, the Clerk shall give notice to 6 7 interested persons that such report has been filed in his office and open to inspection, and of 8 a time and place when such report will be heard by the Board and an assessment ordered. 9 Such notices may be by publication in a newspaper published in the City, or by mail to the 10 assessees of the property at their addresses appearing on the last County tax roll or entitled 11 to be shown on the next equalized roll as determined from the records of the Assessor or ascertained prior to the mailing or as known to the Clerk, at least 10 days before the day set 12 13 for hearing. 14 15 APPROVED AS TO FORM: 16 **DENNIS J.
