16	In Ordinance No. 44-19, in Board File No. 190003, the Board of Supervisors approved		
17	settlement of the claim for \$124,523.97, and erroneously designated the San Francisco Public		
18	Utilities Commission Wastewater Enterprise fund balance as the source of funding		
19	appropriated to settle and compromise the claim.		
20	The funds appropriated by the ordinance in Board File No. 190003 are hereby de-		
21	appropriated, and the source of funding for the \$124,523.97 payment for purposes of the		
22	settlement payment shall be the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission Water Enterprise		
23	Fund balance.
