6	WHEREAS, Gateway High School was one of eight schools in the country identified as
7	exemplary charter schools in the book, Charter High Schools Closing the Achievement Gap:
8	Innovations in Education; and
9	WHEREAS, Gateway High School is a model, college preparatory charter school with a
10	curriculum that exceeds the University of California A-G requirements; and
11	WHEREAS, Gateway High School serves students from over 100 middle schools, with
12	a diverse student population that is 23% African American, 23% Latino, 23% Asian, and 28%
13	White; and
14	WHEREAS, More than a quarter of Gateway students have a learning disability, and
15	more than a third of Gateway students will be the first in their family to attend college; and
16	WHEREAS, More than a third of Gateway students arrive reading below grade level,
17	and yet 95% of Gateway students graduate and attend college; and
18	WHEREAS, Last year, all of the students in Gateway's graduating class passed the
19	California High School Exit Exam in both math and English, and more than a third of Gateway
20	students are currently taking one or more honors or AP class; and
21	WHEREAS, Based on the 2006 API and AYP results, Gateway is now the third highest
22	ranked public high school in San Francisco—and the only one of the three that does not
23	exercise preferential enrollment policies; and
24	WHEREAS, Gateway High School has an average class size of just twenty-two
25	students; and

1	WHEREAS; Every student is paired with an academic advisor, and every student takes
2	a full year of "College Preparation," in which counselors guide them through the college
3	application, admission, and financial aid process; now, therefore, be it
4	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors congratulates Gateway High School on
5	being selected as an exemplary charter school and wishes them continued success in
6	preparing its diverse population of students for college.
