4	Resolution urging San Francisco's State delegation to support efforts requiring testing and ingredient disclosure in cosmetic products, and to support SB 578, which requires manufacturers to disclose chemical ingredients in products as well as the health risks associated with these chemicals.

7	WHEREAS, San Francisco's Precautionary Principle Ordinance states that every San
8	Franciscan has an equal right to a healthy and safe environment, and that the duty to
9	enhance, protect and preserve San Francisco's environment rests on the shoulders of
10	government, residents, citizen groups and businesses alike; and
11	WHEREAS, San Francisco's Precautionary Principle Ordinance also states that while
12	science and technology are creating new solutions to prevent or mitigate environmental
13	problems, science is also creating new compounds and chemicals that are already finding
14	their way into mother's milk and causing other new problems; and,
15	WHEREAS, the US Food and Drug Administration is charged with protecting people
16	from exposure to toxic chemicals in consumer products like cosmetics; however, there is little
17	oversight regarding these chemical ingredients and incomplete product labeling requirements
18	that would disclose information about chemical components and their safety; and,
19	WHEREAS, of the roughly 80,000 chemicals approved by the United States
20	government for use in commerce, almost none of these chemicals have been tested for their
21	effects on the development of reproductive and neurological systems or endocrine functions;
22	and
23	WHEREAS, the European Union and its 450 million citizens are protected from
24	exposure to more than 1,100 chemicals found in cosmetic products because they are known
25	or suspected carcinogens, mutagens or reproductive toxins; and

 development at very low doses and are absorbed through the skin, inhaled or ingested by
 young women of reproductive age when they use the cosmetics or body care products; and
 WHEREAS, companies selling cosmetics and body care products in both the United
 States and Europe sell such products to US consumers that contain the toxic chemicals
 prohibited from sale to European consumers; and

WHEREAS, the University of California has released a detailed report on the
regulation of chemicals in the United States and within California that points to the need for
more information on product ingredients and their potential impacts to human health; now,
therefore, be it

11 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges our representatives in Sacramento 12 to demand that manufactures disclose all ingredients used in cosmetics and other consumer 13 products and perform thorough testing that includes investigation of chemical effects on the 14 endocrine system and reproductive development; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors calls on manufactures of cosmetics to remove all ingredients in their products which can potentially cause cancer and reproductive harm and to formulate products sold in the United States to the same standards required in the European Union; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges our representatives in
 Sacramento to support SB 578 that addresses the need for disclosure and testing to
 determine product safety.
