3	Resolution rejecting the 2007-2008 water and wastewater rates adopted by the San
4	Francisco Public Utilities Commission at its public meeting on May 8, 2007, and
5	requiring the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to adopt new water and
6	wastewater rates that do not adversely affect persons that reside in single-family
7	homes.
8	
9	WHEREAS, The 2007-2008 adopted by the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission
10	at its public meeting on May 8, 2007 contain a new three-tiered residential water conservation
11	rate that is applicable only to single-family homes; and,
12	WHEREAS, The proposed three-tiered residential water conservation rate applies only
13	to single- family residences, occupants of single-family homes will pay considerably more for
14	water and sewer usage than those residents would pay for the same usage if they lived in
15	multi-family buildings; and,
16	WHEREAS, Single-family homes use less than one-fifth of the total water consumed in
17	San Francisco; and,
18	WHEREAS, San Francisco has seen a steady decline the number of families living in
19	the City, and should remedy the economic conditions that cause families to leave San
20	Francisco; and,
21	WHEREAS, Under the provisions of Proposition E, which was passed by the voters of
22	San Francisco in November of 2002, rates, fees and other charges in connection with
23	providing utility services under the jurisdiction of the San Francisco Public Utilities
24	Commission are subject to rejection within thirty days of submission by resolution of the
25	Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it
