Resolution indicating that the City and County of San Francisco's top Budget Priority is ensuring that HIV/AIDS programs are fully funded despite the lack of support from the Federal Government.
WHEREAS, The City's annual budget is the most meaningful policy
document of the City and County of San Francisco; and
WHEREAS, The annual budget determines how the City prioritizes its
functions and responsibilities, as well as the benefits and services that San
Francisco residents receives; and
WHEREAS, San Francisco is facing severe cuts to its allocation of Federally
funded Ryan White CARE Act, totaling more than Nine Million Dollars, which is more than
33% of the total Federal appropriation; and
WHEREAS, These cuts, if not restored, will effect thousands of San
Franciscan's living with HIV/AIDS; and
WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has historically fully
funded a wide array of community-based HIV/AIDS services and programs that
assure people with HIV/AIDS full access to health care, housing, food, financial
assistance, mental health and substance abuse treatment, emotional support
and other vital supportive services; and
WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco will continue to make
HIV/AIDS funding its top priority; and
WHEREAS, San Francisco's Board of Supervisors urges the

1	Federal Government to revisit its funding policies and priorities for HIV/AIDS
2	funding throughout the Nation and to ensure that funding for vital HIV/AIDS
3	services continue to increase rather than decrease as we have witnessed over
4	the past six years; and now, therefore, be it
5	RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco calls
6	on the Federal Government to fund HIV/AIDS services at an increased level and
7 8	immediately stop the funding cuts that threaten the health and well-being of people
9	living with HIV/AIDS throughout the country; and, be it
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor and Board of Supervisors support the current
11	local planning effort to analyze the existing system of HIV/AIDS care in San Francisco,
