3	Resolution encouraging security contractors and building owners to come to the
4	bargaining table with the single purpose to improve industry standards by providing
5	adequate training and increased wages and benefits for private security officers.
6	WHEREAS, More than one million private security officers, or more than twice the
7	number of police officers, are employed in the United States; and
8	WHEREAS, Private security is one of the ten fastest growing occupations in the United
9	States whose workforce is disproportionately drawn from the African American, Filipino and
10	immigrant communities; and
11	WHEREAS, The events of September 11, 2001 emphasized the value of private
12	security officers in protecting lives and property; and
13	WHEREAS, Many private security officers in the Bay Area are working two to three
	jobs to sustain their families, and are without affordable family health coverage; and
14	WHEREAS, Offering Bay Area private security officers wages and benefits in parity
15	with janitorial workers would grow the Bay Area economy by approximately \$7,000,000
16	annually; and
17	WHEREAS, On June 28, 2007, one thousand Bay Area security officers are launching
18	the Stand for Security Campaign 2007; and
19	WHEREAS, Renegotiations of the master contract offers an opportunity to
20	professionalize the private security workforce by providing enhanced training and emergency
	preparedness; and
21	WHEREAS, The private security industry is encouraged to develop a career ladder with
22	standards for unbiased hiring and promotions including compensation commensurate with the
23	duties and responsibilities; and be it
24	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors encourages security
25	contractors and building owners to come to the bargaining table with a single purpose: to

1	improve industry standards by providing adequate training and increased wages and benefits
	for private security officers; and be it
2	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors stands with
3	private security officers who deserve a better quality of life for themselves and their families;
4	and be it
5	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby
6	proclaims June 28, 2007 as Bay Area Private Security Officers Day in San Francisco, in
7	recognition of the National Stand for Security Campaign 2007.
