11		Section 1. F	indings.	
12	(a) General Findings.			
13	(1)	San Francisco has a proud tradition of neighborhoods and thriving commercial		
14	districts that reflect the diverse character of the city.			
15	(2)	The Westerr	n SoMa Planning Area Special Use District houses important	
16	production, distribution, and repair ("PDR") services that are a vital part of the San Francisco			
17	and regional economy, including the flower industry. For purposes of this Ordinance, PDR is			
18	defined as set forth in Planning Commission Resolution Number 16727 (2004), a copy of			
19	which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No			
20	(3)	The Westerr	n SoMa Citizens Planning Task Force is developing proposed	
21	controls to protect existing PDR businesses from displacement and establish appropriate uses			
22	in the Western SoMa and is scheduled to release their draft plan by, 2008.			
23	(4)	Large educa	tional institutions can displace production, distribution, and repair	
24	services that the City is fostering in this special use district. Such institutions, when properly			
25	sited, also can enhance and enliven other neighborhoods.			

1 (5) The General Plan encourages large developments and institutional uses, such 2 as educational institutional uses, to locate in areas of the City where existing public transit and 3 other services can easily accommodate such uses. Portions of the Western SoMa Planning 4 Area Special Use District are underserved by public transit and other services, and therefore, 5 this District is not an appropriate location for such uses.

6 (6) This Board, in Ordinance No. 280-07, imposed an initial 45-day moratorium on 7 institutional uses in the subject area. A copy of that Ordinance is on file with the Clerk of the 8 Board of Supervisors in File No. 071534 and is incorporated by reference herein.

9 (7)Pursuant to Ordinance No. 280-07, the Planning Department, on January 9, 10 2008, issued a report on the subject moratorium and made various recommendations for 11 permanent zoning controls. On January 14, 2008, the Board of Supervisors' Land Use 12 Committee conducted a hearing on a Motion concerning said report and recommended that 13 the full Board approve the Motion. The public testimony and documents related to this Motion 14 are part of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors File No. 080036 and are incorporated herein by reference. The Board of Supervisors in Motion No. ______, adopted said report. 15 16 A copy of the Motion and the report are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in 17 File No. 080036 and are incorporated herein by reference

18 (8) On _____, the Board of Supervisors adopted Urgency Ordinance extending the interim zoning moratorium to prohibit the establishment of new 19 20 institutional uses in the Western SoMa Planning Area Special Use District for 22 months and 21 15 days from the termination date of Ordinance No. 280-07 in accordance with California 22 Government Code Section 65858 or until permanent controls are adopted to address 23 institutional uses in the Western SOMA, whichever first occurs. 24 (9) This Ordinance and companion legislation in Clerk of the Board of Supervisors

25 File No. ______ concerning educational institutions are intended to serve as the

permanent control to address the abovementioned issues, and therefore, upon this Ordinance
 being final and effective, the interim zoning moratorium set forth in Ordinance No.

3 ______ shall be repealed. The companion legislation is incorporated herein by
4 reference

5 (b) Environmental Findings, General Plan Findings, and Other Required Findings.

(1) The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this
Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public
Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the
Board of Supervisors in File No. ______ and is incorporated herein by

10 reference.

(2) On ______, 2008, the Planning Commission, in Resolution
No. ______ approved and recommended for adoption by the Board this legislation
and adopted findings that it is consistent, on balance, with the City's General Plan and eight
priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1 The Board adopts these findings as its own.
A copy of said Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.

16 _____, and is incorporated by reference herein.

17 (3) Pursuant to Planning Code Section 302, this Board of Supervisors finds that this
18 legislation will serve the public necessity, convenience, and welfare for the reasons set forth in
19 Planning Commission Resolution No. ______, and incorporates such reasons by
20 reference herein.

Section 3. The San Francisco Planning Code is hereby amended by amending
Section 823 to read as follows:

23 Sec. 823. WESTERN SOMA PLANNING AREA SPECIAL USE DISTRICT.

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1 (*a*) The Western SoMa Planning Area Special Use District, as shown on Section 2 Maps 1SU, 7SU, and 8SU of the Zoning Map, is governed buy Sections 80-3.6 and 803.7 of 3 this Code, and Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 731-04.

- (b) The area of the City known as Western South of Market ("Western SoMa") is
 currently undergoing a comprehensive community-based planning process pursuant to
 Resolution No. 731-04, which was adopted by the Board of Supervisors on November 23,
 2004. Resolution 731-04 established a 22-member Western SoMa Citizens Planning Task
 Force charged with advising the Board of Supervisors and Planning Commission on future
 planning for the area. The Western SoMa Planning Area Special Use District will further
 recognition of the Western SoMa as a special planning area of the City.

(c) Educational Service uses as defined by Section 890.50(c) are prohibited in the Western

12 <u>SoMa Planning Area Special Use District.</u>

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, clause, phrase, or portion of this
Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court or federal or State
agency of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and
independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions
thereof.
