5	WHEREAS, The American Red Cross Bay Area was founded in 1898; and,
6	WHEREAS, The Red Cross, a leading voluntary agency, chartered and authorized by
7	Congress to act in times of need, providing compassionate assistance to people afflicted by
8	personal, local or national disasters; and,
9	WHEREAS, The American Red Cross Bay Area helped 900 families with temporary
10	housing, clothing, food and mental health counseling during 500 local disasters last year
11	alone; and,
12	WHEREAS, People have counted on the Red Cross for the information and skills they
13	need to be safe at home, at work, at school, and at play; and,
14	WHEREAS, Last year, the American Red Cross Bay Area trained over 140,000 people
15	in lifesaving CPR, First Aid, and water safety; and,
16	WHEREAS, Through the Prepare Bay Area initiative and Community Preparedness
17	programs, over 160,000 individuals received training, and
18	WHEREAS, Red Cross staff deploy with the U.S. military to provide emergency
19	communications, counseling, financial assistance and a caring presence to 2,200 local military
20	families; and
21	WHEREAS, Red Cross Blood Services support 31 Bay Area hospitals, providing them
22	with more than 134,000 units of red cells, platelets and plasma to patients in need: now,
