[19 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Avenue corridor speed limit reduction.]

## Resolution urging the MTA to support Caltrans' recommendation to lower the speed limit along the $19^{\text {th }}$ Avenue corridor from 35 mph to 30 mph .

WHEREAS, The seven miles of $19^{\text {th }}$ Avenue/Park Presidio which serve as State Route 1 in San Francisco had 1205 injuries and 12 deaths from 786 collisions between 2000 and 2005; and,

WHEREAS, Six of those 12 deaths were pedestrians attempting to cross the six-lane thoroughfare; and,

WHEREAS, There were 9 collisions and 1 fatality in 2006 and 2007; and,
WHEREAS, State Route 1 carries nearly 100,000 vehicles per day; and,
WHEREAS, The Governor of California has vetoed Senator Yee's legistlation to create a "double fine zone" on the $19^{\text {th }}$ Avenue corridor two years in a row; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA made a request to the California Transportation Agency (Caltrans) in February 2006 for an Engineering and Traffic Survey to study prevailing speeds along this corridor; and,

WHEREAS, Caltrans completed an Engineering and Traffic for Route 1 ( $19^{\text {th }}$ Avenue and Park Presidio Boulevard) in March of 2008; and

WHEREAS, Based on the results of their survey and evaluation, Caltrans has determined that it is appropriate to decrease the existing speed limit on Route 1 from 35 mph to 30 mph between 130 feet north of Eucalyptus Drive and Martin Luther King Jr. Drive; and,

WHEREAS, Section 22.5 of the California Vehicle Code stipulates that before Caltrans can implement this speed limit change, they must take into consideration the results of a public hearing conducted by the City to consider the issue; and, WHEREAS, The public hearing is scheduled to take place at the April 1, 2008, SFMTA Board of Directors meeting; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the SFMTA Board of Directors to support the Caltrans recommendation to lower the speed limit from 35 mph to 30 mph on a portion of California State Route 1 ( $19^{\text {th }}$ Avenue and Park Presidio Boulevard) in San Francisco.
