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Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH) to accept and expend a three-year grant in the amount of \$343,000 from the Vitamin Cases

Consumer Settlement Fund to support the "Women's Nutritional Awareness Project," for the period of July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2011.

WHEREAS, DPH was awarded \$343,000 through the Vitamin Cases Consumer Settlement Fund to support a three-year project with the working title "Women's Nutritional Awareness Project," for the period of July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2011; and,

WHEREAS, These funds will allow DPH's Maternal, Child and Adolescent Health unit to increase folic acid supplementation among women of childbearing age in San Francisco by educating providers, clients and the general public about the importance of practicing good nutrition including adequate folic acid intake prior to becoming pregnant; and,

WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds the Vitamin Cases Consumer Settlement Fund, Superior Court of the City & County of San Francisco requires DPH to enter into Grant Agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. <u>080476</u>, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully within; and,

WHEREAS, An ASO amendment is not required as the grant partially reimburses DPH for four existing positions, including Health Program Coordinator I (Job Class #2589) at .50 FTE, Health Worker III (Job Class #2587) at .15 FTE, Clerk Typist (Job Class #1424) at .20 FTE, and As-needed Medical Specialist (Job Class #P103) at .05 FTE for the period of July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2011; and,

1	WHEREAS, The budget includes a provision for indirect costs of \$7,248; now

6	expend the grant funds pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 10.170-1; and,

8	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the				
9	agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it				
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate all positions				
11	funded under this agreement as "G" or grant-funded positions which would terminate when				
12	the agreement expires.
