WHEREAS, Since 1972, when she helped found Delancey Street, Mimi Silbert has worked tirelessly to improve the lives of thousands of people who faced multiple convictions and would otherwise have spent their lives behind bars; and

WHEREAS, Since its creation, Delancey Street has rehabilitated and reintegrated more than 14,000 formerly-convicted individuals back into society, giving them the ability and the opportunity to leave their self-destructive cycles and take responsibility for themselves and others; and,

WHEREAS, Delancey Street provides jobs, education, and life skills training to its many residents; and,

WHEREAS, In 1990, Silbert was the developer and Delancey Street was its own contractor, in building its mixed-use facility on the Embarcadero which houses about 500 residents and includes a health club, swimming pool, cinema, restaurant, and a coffee house;

WHEREAS, Under Silbert's leadership, Delancey Street now has centers located in New York, New Mexico, North Carolina, and Los Angeles, along with their headquarters in San Francisco, which is the largest self-managed, self-built self-help complex in the country: and 25
