3	Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH) to accept		
4	and expend retroactively a one-time funding award of Ryan White Part A (RWPA) funds		
5	for the San Francisco Eligible Metropolitan Area (SF EMA) in the amount of \$4,758,228		
6	from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to support HIV Health		
7	Services; for the period of July 1, 2007 through February 29, 2008.		
8	WHEREAS, For the fiscal year 2007-2008, DPH was awarded a Ryan White Part A		
9	(RWPA) program grant by the Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA) in the		
10	amount of \$18.8 million, a 31% decrease from the fiscal year 2006-2007 grant of \$27.3		
11	million;		
12	WHEREAS, This reduction in federal grant funds precipitated an immediate crisis that		
13	threatened the most basic HIV services and the region's entire integrated system of care;		
14	WHEREAS, This percentage reduction occurred not only for San Francisco but also for		
15	other local jurisdictions across the nation;		
16	WHEREAS, In response to this threat to HIV services, in the Consolidated		
17	Appropriations Act, 2008, Congress lessened the percentage cuts for San Francisco and		
18	other local jurisdictions by enacting a supplemental appropriation for Ryan White program		
19	year 2007-2008 (March 1, 2007 to February 28, 2008) to be included in the fiscal year 2008-		
20	2009 Ryan White grants. The federal appropriation legislation states that "funds shall be		
21	made available to qualifying jurisdictions within 45 days of enactment, for increasing		
22	supplemental grants for fiscal year 2008 to metropolitan areas that received grant funding in		
23	fiscal year 2007 to ensure that an areas' total funding under part A for fiscal year 2007,		
24	together with the amount of this additional funding, is not less that 85.6% of the amount of		
25	such areas' total funding under part A for fiscal year 2006";

WHEREAS, The federal appropriation bill expressly made the supplemental funding
 retroactive to the Ryan White 2007-2008 fiscal year, stating that the additional funding "may
 be used for costs incurred during fiscal year 2007 "

WHEREAS, The grant award to San Francisco similarly makes the funding retroactive to the Ryan White fiscal year 2007-2008 by expressly stating that the funding may be used for costs already incurred during that Ryan White program year (March 1, 2007 to February 28, 2008). The grant award states: "This award included one time additional funding in the amount of \$4,758,228, authorized under the Consolidated Appropriations Act 2008, Public Law 110-161, to support costs incurred (if any) during Fiscal Year 2007 under Part A of Title XXXVI of the Public Health Service Act";

WHEREAS, Because the 2008-2009 Ryan White grant expressly states that the
supplemental \$4.7 million in funds may be used to "support costs incurred (if any) during
Fiscal Year 2007 under Part A," the City is authorized to use those funds to pay for the costs
already incurred during the Ryan White program year 2007-2008, which ended on February
28, 2008, and,

16 WHEREAS, During fiscal year 2007-2008, San Francisco incurred substantial costs in order to continue to provide HIV services at the level provided in the prior fiscal year and 17 18 avoid the funding crisis that threatened the most basic services. In order to meet those costs, avoid crisis and in anticipation of obtaining supplemental federal funding, San Francisco 19 20 provided one time emergency funding as a loan of approximately \$4.0 million from the City's 21 general fund reserve to fund the shortfall in Ryan White Part A funds, and in doing so reduced 22 the general fund reserve below its base for the first time, and 23 WHEREAS, The \$4.0 million emergency funding was made on the condition that if the

24 City received additional Ryan White Part A funds for fiscal year 2007-2008, the \$4.0

emergency funding would be returned to the City's general fund. In connection with the \$4.0

million, the City's Annual Administrative Ordinance, Section 8.2, directed the Controller to
repay the \$4.0 million emergency funding to the General Fund reserve if additional state or
federal funds were allocated to San Francisco.

WHEREAS, The City's "maintenance of effort spending" on HIV related services has
increased from \$14.2 million in 2001 to \$16.7 million in 2006 to \$17.8 million in 2007. The
\$4.0 million emergency nonrecurring funding was *in addition to* \$17.8 million that the City
appropriated for certain HIV services in City fiscal year 2007-2008.;

8 WHEREAS, Under HRSA guidelines, the \$4.0 million emergency funding is not part of 9 the City's required "maintenance of effort" (level of grantee expenditures to be maintained) 10 because it was a one-time emergency infusion of funds. The Ryan White CARE Act Title I 11 Manual, Section II, chapter 4 states that "maintenance of effort" does not "include 12 expenditures of a nonrecurring nature." The Manual explains that: "Grantees may determine 13 which expenditures are of a nonrecurring nature and are therefore excluded from the 14 maintenance of effort calculations. An example of a nonrecurring expenditure is a one-time 15 infusion of funds into a political subdivision program on an emergency basis, where the 16 appropriations or other authorizing language clearly identifies it as a one-time-only commitment." 17

WHEREAS, This request that the Board approve this resolution is being made on a retroactive basis, with a start date of July 1, 2007 through February 29, 2008, because the federal funds are to be encumbered in Ryan White program year 2007-08 and the award letter for additional funds was not received by DPH until late February 2008; and,

WHEREAS, The budget does not include a provision for indirect costs because HRSA
does not allow it; now therefore, be it

24 RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to accept and expend retroactively a grant 25 for the RWPA program from HRSA in the amount of \$4,758,228; and, be it

9	agreement on behalf of the City.
