11	Section 1. The City Attorney and the General Manager of the San Francisco Public					
12	Utilities Commission (PUC) are hereby authorized to accept a Settlement Agreement in					
13	proceedings before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), consolidated in					
14	Docket Nos. EL03-152 et al., related to the electricity crisis of 2000-2001. The Board of					
15	Supervisors hereby approves the City's acceptance of its share of funds collected by FERC					
16	through settlement and administrative penalties, currently expected to total approximately					
17	\$35,000.					
18	Section 2. Background to the Settlement Agreement.					
19	A. The central issue of the Settlement Agreement is the distribution of a pool of					
20	money paid to FERC in accordance with various settlements or administrative penalties					
21	related to the electricity crisis of 2000-01. In November 2007, FERC staff initiated negotiations					
22	to reach an agreement on distribution of the funds FERC holds. FERC staff held settlement					
23	conferences and facilitated extensive negotiations.					
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1	C.	C. On November 29, 2007, San Francisco moved to intervene in the phase of the					
2	proceedings	addressing the distri	bution of funds.	San Francisco submitted a cla	im based on		
3	the City's electricity sales and purchases during the 2000-2001 time period.						
4	D. On July 11, 2008, parties reached a Settlement Agreement providing for						
5	distribution of settlement funds collected by FERC.						
6	Section 3. Funds received by the City from this settlement shall be appropriated to
