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12	WHEREAS, San Francisco's Eastern Neighborhoods comprise the mixed-use and	
13	mixed-income communities of the Mission, Eastern SoMa, Central Waterfront and Showplace	
14	Square/Potrero Hill, and these communities have historically been the location of much of the	
15	City's industrial land supply and some of its lower-cost housing. Strong development interest	
16	and community planning efforts call for a significant amount of new residential and	
17	commercial growth in the Eastern Neighborhoods; and,	
18	WHEREAS, The City's Planning Department has completed a multi-year planning	
19	process for the Eastern Neighborhoods that resulted in the Eastern Neighborhoods Area Plan	
20	(the "EN Plan"), which rezoned previous districts to reduce land use conflicts between	
21	Production, Distribution and Repair ("PDR") businesses and other competing uses, to retain	
22	existing PDR jobs in some areas and to encourage diverse housing affordable to a range of	
23	incomes and commercial and mixed-uses in other areas; and,	
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WHEREAS, The EN Plan is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File
 No. 081152, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein;
 and,

WHEREAS, Following adoption of the EN Plan, the City's Planning Department
anticipates significant new housing units and other development within the EN Plan Area, and
this future development will impact the EN Plan Area's neighborhood infrastructure by
generating greater need for new investment in recreation and open space facilities, transit and
transportation improvements, streetscape improvements, and affordable housing and
community facilities; and,

WHEREAS, To ensure that new neighborhood infrastructure and public benefits are provided concurrently with the demands generated by new growth, various City agencies have negotiated an Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") to prioritize funding and planning efforts for capital projects as described in the MOU to support the demands generated by future development in the EN Area, a copy of which MOU is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 081446; and,

16 WHEREAS, As set forth in the MOU, all funding and planning commitments for the 17 proposed capital projects are expressly subject to applicable law, including but not limited to 18 compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act, and the future budgetary decisions 19 of participating City agencies, and nothing in the MOU or this resolution limits the discretion of future boards and commissions, including this Board, with respect to these projects or any 20 21 alternatives to these projects, including but not limited to a no-project alternative; and, 22 WHEREAS, In accordance with the adoption of the EN Plan, this Board adopted Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_ (File No. 081152), making findings pursuant to the California 23 24

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Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.), which
findings are incorporated herein by this reference (the "CEQA Findings"); and,

WHEREAS, The City's Planning Department adopted and issued a General Plan
Consistency Finding, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board, wherein the City's
Planning Department found that the adoption of the EN Plan is consistent with the City's
General Plan and with the Eight Priority Policies under Planning Code Section 101.1; now,
therefore, be it

8 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors confirms the CEQA Findings and the 9 General Plan Consistency Finding, and incorporates such Findings into this resolution; and, 10 be it

11 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the MOU, subject to the approval of the affected City departments and commissions, and following all such 12 13 approvals, the Board authorizes City staff to take actions consistent with the MOU; and, be it 14 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the City 15 departments executing the MOU to enter into any additions, amendments or other 16 modifications that they mutually determine are in the best interest of the City and the 17 respective departments, do not add costs to or create liabilities for the City, and do not 18 substantively change the material terms of the MOU; and, be it 19 FURTHER RESOLVED, That any action previously taken by any City employee or 20 official in accordance with the MOU are hereby ratified and affirmed; and, be it 21 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby directs the Capital 22 Planning Committee to establish a subcommitee as establishes the Eastern Neighborhoods 23 Infrastructure Finance Working Group (the "EN Finance Working Group") to prepare a specific 24 set of proposals or recommendations to the Board of Supervisors for financing the

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1 infrastructure and other public benefits to be constructed in the EN Plan Area, including but 2 not limited to consideration of the creation of a permanent "special fund" set aside, the 3 creation of an infrastructure finance district ("IFD"), and/or the adoption of new state 4 legislation to amend existing law relating to Tax increment Financing or IFDs as may be 5 necessary or appropriate, and to provide such proposals or recommendations within six (6) 6 months following the adoption of this resolution; and, be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That the EN Finance Working Group be comprised of, at a 7 minimum, four five (4)(5) City employees and three (3) members of the public; and, be it 8 9 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the four five (4)(5) City employees shall be one representative from each of the following City departments or committee, appointed by the 10 11 head of each such department or committee: the Planning Department, the Office of 12 Economic and Workforce Development, the Mayor's Office of Public Policy and Finance, the 13 <u>Controller's Office</u> and the Capital Planning Committee; and, be it 14 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the three (3) members of the public on the EN Finance Group shall be appointed by the President of the Board of Supervisors, and further filled upon 15 16 any resignation or vacancy by the President of the Board of Supervisors. 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25

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
