- Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
- 11 Section 1. General Findings:
- 12 (a) Studies estimate a 63 percent probability that a major earthquake will strike the 13Bay Area within the next 30 years. If such an event were to occur before the SFPUC 14completes seismic improvements under its Water System Improvement Program ("WSIP"), 15parts of the Bay Area could be without water for extended periods, causing catastrophic 16economic and public health impacts. The SFPUC must implement the WSIP without delay.
- 17 (b) The most important WSIP seismic improvement projects are the 50 regional 18 projects, many of which are relatively large and/or complex. Most of the regional projects will 19 undergo the critical transition from design to construction beginning in late 2008 through 2010.
- 20 (c) To ensure program continuity and to avoid delays while the WSIP's significant 21 regional projects transition from design to construction, the SFPUC must retain a program 22 construction management consultant without delay to supplement existing resources and 23 provide personnel with specialized qualifications and experience. The program construction 24 manager will oversee ongoing construction projects to ensure the overall effectiveness of the 25 SFPUC's construction management organization and advise WSIP management on key

1 construction management-related processes, systems and procedures.

- 2 (d) Section 6.40 of the Administrative Code, Competitive Procurement of 3Professional Services for Public Work Projects, requires City departments to procure 4professional consultant services using a competitive process based on qualifications. Section 56.41, Requests for Competitive Proposals or Qualifications, sets forth minimum requirements 6for the competitive procurement process.
- 7 (e) A competitive procurement process to select and retain a program construction 8 manager could require approximately six months, resulting in significant project delays during 9 the critical transition from design to construction of the WSIP regional projects. A waiver of 10 sections 6.40 and 6.41 would enable the SFPUC to retain a qualified program construction 11 manager much sooner and mitigate the risk of project delays.
- 12 (f) The SFPUC, by Resolution No. 08-0205, awarded Agreement No. CS-963, 13Program Construction Management Services, for an amount not to exceed \$26,000,000, 14contingent on the Board granting a waiver of sections 6.40 and 6.41 and approving the 15Agreement under Charter Section 9.118.
- Section 2. Waiver of Administrative Code Sections 6.40 and 6.41:
- 17 (a) By this Ordinance, the Board of Supervisors grants the SFPUC a waiver of 18Administrative Code sections 6.40 and 6.41 to allow the award of Agreement No. CS-963, 19Program Construction Management Services, without a competitive procurement process.
