5	WHEREAS, A multiracial group of activists founded the National Association for the
6	Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) on February 12th, 1909; and
7	WHEREAS, For one hundred years, the NAACP has been in the forefront of civil rights
8	advocacy and has earned its place in American history as the single most important civil rights
9	organization in the nation; and,
10	WHEREAS, The NAACP has successfully lobbied for changes in politics, employment,
11	education, public accommodations, health and housing and has helped pave for the way for
12	the continued advancement of racial equality; and,
13	WHEREAS, In 1982, the San Francisco chapter of the NAACP filed a lawsuit against
14	the San Francisco Unified School District, which led the SFUSD to revise their admission
15	policies in an attempt to reduce racial segregation and close the achievement gap between
16	different racial populations; and,
17	WHEREAS, In 2008, the NAACP selected Benjamin Todd Jealous as their new
18	president; and,
19	WHEREAS, Benjamin Todd Jealous is a Northern California native who was previously
20	president of the Rosenberg Foundation, a San Francisco-based civil and human rights
21	advocacy organization; and,
22	WHEREAS, By selecting Benjamin Todd Jealous, age thirty-five, as their president, the
23	NAACP has shown a commitment to engaging younger generations in their ongoing and
24	evolving work to ensure political, educational, social, and economic equality for all citizens;

1	WHEREAS, In 2005, the NAACP began the Leadership 500 Summit, which has trained
2	more than 1,200 mid-level professionals between the ages of 30 and 50 on issues of
3	economic parity, health and wellness as a business imperative, and early childhood
4	education; and,
