[Federal Economic Recovery Support for Balboa Park Station Area Plan]

Resolution urging city departments to set the Balboa Park Station Area Plan as an
identified priority when seeking Federal Economic Stimulus funding, and to work with
San Francisco's Congressional delegation to ensure, to the extent possible, that
Federal Economic Recovery legislation includes funding for the Balboa Park Station
Area Plan.

8 WHEREAS, The Balboa Park Station Area Plan is a comprehensive vision for the 9 redevelopment and revitalization of the Balboa Park area and the surrounding 210 acres, and 10 promotes transit and bicycle use, creates pedestrian friendly environments, strengthens 11 neighborhood-serving areas, provides open spaces, and increases supply and variety of 12 housing for residents; and,

WHEREAS, The Balboa Park Station Area Plan is a multi-agency effort, including the
work of, but not limited to, the Planning Department, the Municipal Transportation Agency, the
Office of Economic and Workforce Development, Bay Area Rapid Transit, the San Francisco
Public Utilities Commission, San Francisco City College, and the San Francisco County
Transportation Authority; and,

WHEREAS, The current Federal Economic Recovery legislation moving through
 Congressional approval is designed to fuel the economy and stimulate job growth, by
 investing in sustainable, energy-saving infrastructure; and

21 WHEREAS, Priorities and criteria for eligibility for federal economic stimulus funding 22 should include programs that will create immediate jobs, improve infrastructure that benefits 23 the public and private sector, help small businesses succeed, and create lasting economic 24 and environmental benefits; and,

1 WHEREAS, The Balboa Park Station Area Plan includes elements that are central to 2 the goals of the federal economic recovery package, such as long-term job creation, including 3 225 jobs in construction, one of the industries suffering the greatest job loss in the Bay Area; 4 lasting improvements to critical transit infrastructure; investment and stimulation of 5 commercial corridors in our neighborhoods; and ongoing economic and environmental 6 benefits, including much needed housing; and, 7 WHEREAS, Our current fiscal crisis is exactly the right time to support and ensure the 8 success of long-term projects such as the Balboa Park Station Area Plan that can have 9 immediate and lasting benefits for working families, local businesses, and the weakened 10 economy; now, therefore, be it 11 RESOLVED, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the departments and 12 local agencies that are involved in the Balboa Park Station Area Plan, to set the Balboa Park 13 Station Area Plan as an identified priority, when applying for Federal Economic Stimulus 14 funding; and, be it 15 FURTHER RESOLVED, That we encourage these same departments and agencies to 16 collaborate with our Congressional representatives to ensure to the extent possible that 17 Balboa Park Station Area Plan projects are included in recommendations for federal 18 economic stimulus funding. 19 20 21 22 23 24 25
