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ORDINANCE NO.

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3	Ordinance amending the San Francisco General Plan by approving General Plan
4	amendments to implement the Visitacion Valley Redevelopment Plan (which includes a
5	portion of the Visitacion Valley neighborhood and the Schlage Lock site within the City
6	and County of San Francisco, the boundaries of which are designated on Sectional
7	Map No. 10 SU of the Zoning Maps of the City and County of San Francisco, and which
8	generally includes the properties bounded by Bayshore, Blanken and Tunnel Avenue to
9	the San Francisco/San Mateo County line to the south, including the properties fronting
10	Bayshore Boulevard from Arleta Avenue to the San Francisco/San Mateo County line to
11	the south and including the properties fronting Leland Avenue from Cora Street to
12	Bayshore Boulevard) by amending the Arts Element, Commerce and Industry Element,
13	Recreation and Open Space Element, Transportation Element, and Urban Design
14	Elements; making environmental findings and findings that the proposed amendments

15 are consistent with the General Plan and the eight priority policies of the Planning

- 20 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
- 21 Section 1. Findings.
- A. Section 4.105 of the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco provides
- that the Planning Commission shall periodically recommend to the Board of Supervisors, for
- approval or rejection, proposed amendments to the General Plan.

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B. On <u>February 13, 2009</u>, the Board of Supervisors received from the Planning
 Department proposed General Plan amendments to the Arts, Commerce and Industry,
 Recreation and Open Space, Transportation, and Urban Design Elements of the General
 Plan, which was adopted by the Planning Commission on <u>December 18, 2008</u>.

C. Section 4.105 of the City Charter further provides that if the Board of
Supervisors fails to Act within 90 days of receipt of the proposed General Plan Amendment,
then the proposed amendment shall be deemed approved.

8 D. San Francisco Planning Code Section 340 provides that an amendment to the 9 General Plan may be initiated by a resolution of intention by the Planning Commission, which 10 refers to, and incorporates by reference, the proposed General Plan amendment. Planning 11 Code Section 340 further provides that the Planning Commission shall adopt the proposed General Plan amendment after a public hearing if it finds from the facts presented that the 12 13 public necessity, convenience and general welfare require the proposed amendment or any 14 part thereof. If adopted by the Planning Commission in whole or in part, the proposed amendment shall be presented to the Board of Supervisors, which may approve or reject the 15 16 amendment by a majority vote.

17 E. On <u>November 20, 2008</u>, the Planning Commission adopted Resolution No.

<u>17767</u> initiating an amendment to the General Plan, at a duly noticed public
hearing. A copy of Planning Commission Resolution No. <u>17767</u> is on file with the
Clerk of the Board in File No. <u>090202</u>.

- F. On <u>December 18, 2008</u>, at a duly noticed public meeting, the Planning Commission certified the Final EIR for the proposed Visitacion Valley Redevelopment Program (the "Project") by Motion No. <u>17786</u> finding the Final EIR reflected the independent judgment and analysis of the City and County of San Francisco, is adequate, accurate and
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objective, contains no significant revisions to the Draft EIR, and the content of the report and
the procedures through which the Final EIR was prepared, publicized and reviewed comply
with the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") (California Public
Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.), the CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. Section
15000 et seq.), and Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code. A copy of the Final
EIR is on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. <u>090202</u>.

G. The Project evaluated in the Final EIR includes amendments to the General
Plan, Planning Code and Zoning Map and other project approvals related to the Project
proposed by the Planning Department. The Visitacion Valley Schlage Lock General Plan
amendment is an action proposed by the Planning Department that is within the scope of the
Project evaluated in the Final EIR.

H. At the same hearing during which the Planning Commission certified the Final
 EIR, the Planning Commission adopted CEQA Findings with respect to the approval of the
 proposed Redevelopment Project for the Visitacion Valley Redevelopment Plan, in Motion No.
 _____17790____.

16 I. The Board of Supervisors has reviewed and considered the Final EIR and the 17 environmental documents on file referred to herein. The Board of Supervisors has reviewed 18 and considered the CEQA Findings adopted by the Planning Commission in support of the 19 approval of the Project, including the mitigation monitoring and reporting program and the 20 statement of overriding considerations, and hereby adopts as its own and incorporates the 21 CEQA Findings contained in Planning Commission Motion <u>17790</u> by reference as 22 though such findings were fully set forth in this Ordinance.

J. The Board of Supervisors endorses the implementation of the mitigation
 measures identified in the Planning Commission's CEQA Findings for implementation by other

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City Departments and recommends for adoption those mitigation measures that are
 enforceable by agencies other than City agencies, all as set forth in the CEQA Findings,
 including the mitigation monitoring and reporting program contained in the referenced CEQA
 Findings.

K. The Board of Supervisors finds that no substantial changes have occurred in the 5 Project proposed for approval under this Ordinance that will require revisions in the Final EIR 6 7 due to the involvement of new significant environmental effects or a substantial increase in the 8 severity of previously identified significant effects, no substantial changes have occurred with 9 respect to the circumstances under which the Project proposed for approval under the 10 Ordinance are undertaken which will require major revisions to the Final EIR due to the 11 involvement of new environmental effects or a substantial increase in the severity of effects identified in the Final EIR and no new information of substantial importance to the Project as 12 13 proposed for approval in the Ordinance has become available which indicates that (1) the 14 Project will have significant effects not discussed in the Final EIR. (2) significant 15 environmental effects will be substantially more severe, (3) mitigation measure or alternatives 16 found not feasible which would reduce one or more significant effects have become feasible 17 or (4) mitigation measures or alternatives which are considerably different from those in the 18 Final EIR would substantially reduce one or more significant effects on the environment. 19 Μ. The Board of Supervisors finds, pursuant to Planning Code Section 340, that the Visitacion Valley Redevelopment Program, including this General Plan Amendment, set forth 20 21 in the documents on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. 090202 will 22 serve the public necessity, convenience and general welfare for the reasons set forth in Planning Commission Resolution No. 17791 and incorporates those reasons 23 24 herein by reference.

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N. The Board of Supervisors finds that the Visitacion Valley Redevelopment 1 2 Program, including this General Plan Amendment, as set forth in the documents on file with 3 the Clerk of the Board in File No. 090202 , are in conformity with the 4 General Plan, as it is amended by this Ordinance, and the eight priority policies of Planning 5 Code Section 101.1 for the reasons set forth in Planning Commission Resolution No. 17791_____. The Board hereby adopts the findings set forth in Planning Commission 6 Resolution No. 17791 and incorporates those findings herein by reference. 7 The Board of Supervisors hereby approves the proposed Visitacion 8 Section 2. 9 Valley Redevelopment Plan amendments to the General Plan, as recommended to the Board 10 of Supervisors by the Planning Commission in Resolution No. 17791 and as 11 shown on the maps on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. 090202 , and directs the Planning Department to update the General Plan's Land Use Index to reflect these 12 13 amendments if necessary. These amendments are summarized as follows:

14 A. ARTS ELEMENT.

Amend figure entitled "Motion Picture Theaters." Revise the figure to reflect, for
 the Visitacion Valley/Schlage Lock Redevelopment Project area, a change in the shading from
 a "high" concentration of motion picture theaters to a "low" concentration of motion picture
 theaters.

19 B. COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY ELEMENT.

Amend Map 1, "Generalized Commercial and Industrial Land use Plan." Add a
 boundary around the Visitacion Valley / Schlage Lock area with a line that leads to a
 reference that states "See the Redevelopment Plan for the Visitacion Valley Schlage Lock
 Project."

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Amend Map 2, "Generalized Commercial & Industrial Density Plan." Add a
 boundary around the Visitacion Valley / Schlage Lock area with a line that leads to a
 reference that states "See Redevelopment Plan for the Visitacion Valley Schlage Lock
 Project."

Amend Map 4, "Residential Service Areas of Neighborhood Commercial
 Districts and Uses." Add a boundary around the Visitacion Valley / Schlage Lock area with a
 line that leads to a reference that states "See Redevelopment Plan for the Visitacion Valley
 Schlage Lock Project."

9 4. Amend Map 5, "Generalized Neighborhood Commercial land use and Density
10 Plan." Add a boundary around the Visitacion Valley / Schlage Lock area with a line that leads
11 to a reference that states "See Redevelopment Plan for the Visitacion Valley Schlage Lock
12 Project."

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C. RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE ELEMENT

Amend Map 4, "Citywide Recreation and Open Space Plan." Add a boundary
 around the Visitacion Valley Schlage Lock area with a line that leads to a reference that states
 "See Redevelopment Plan for the Visitacion Valley Schlage Lock Project."
