Candidate statement of qualifications as to demographic qualities of the City and County of San Francisco pursuant to
Charter section 4.101(a)1

Candidate: Sabrina Hernandez, Business Representative/Compliance Officer, IBEW Local Union 6

In advocacy for women and minorities; increased diversity in the organized trades; economic justice for women, minorities and youth; pathways to high-skill/high-pay careers:

As a minority woman in an industry dominated by white men (electrical construction) I am both fortunate to have achieved my level of professional success and challenged to create new ways in which I can assist other San Francisco women, minorities and youth to enter and succeed in high-skill, high-pay careers in the organized trades. This is why, throughout my career, I have maintained an active role in community based organizations such as Tradeswomen Inc, and in AFL-CIO constituency organizations such as the Electrical Workers Minority Caucus (EWMC), Pride @ Work, and the Coalition of Labor Union Women (CLUW), all of which advocate for the rights of women and minorities at work. I am particularly excited about IBEW Local 6 plans to partner with the San Francisco Unified School District in creating a pre-apprenticeship program for San Francisco high school students interested in exploring industrial careers.

In addition to the aforementioned efforts, I also serve on the Board of Directors of Asian Neighborhood Design (“AND”), a San Francisco non-profit organization that offers architectural design services and a construction trades pre-apprenticeship training program. Most of AND’s clients are people of color from disadvantaged economic backgrounds; and the majority are being reintroduced to their communities after recent release from prison.

In efforts to defend the rights of the San Francisco immigrant worker community:

As a business representative and public works contract compliance officer for IBEW Local Union 6, I represent the interests of IBEW members and our management partners; however, much of my work benefits non-unionized immigrant workers primarily from Russia, China, Korea, Mexico, and Central America. As immigrants, many of whom have limited English language skills, these workers are vulnerable and often taken advantage of; paid less than the wages required by law, asked to perform work in unsafe conditions, not compensated for overtime and otherwise abused of their rights. As I monitor public works projects in San Francisco, I often meet workers experiencing these unfortunate and illegal conditions. My position and training allow me to educate them on their rights under the law and assist them in seeking remedies through the San Francisco Office of Labor Standards Enforcement and other authorities having jurisdiction.

In addition to my professional work to defend immigrants, I also volunteer for *SF We Rise* – The San Francisco Labor Council Center for Immigrant Justice; and I regularly participate at weekend citizenship workshops with the San Francisco Pathways to Citizenship Initiative.





Bicycle Commuter Act of 2019, HR 1507

GOLD

What it is »

HR 1507, the Bicycle Commuter Act of 2019 extends commuter benefits to employees who choose to bike to work, similar to parking or transit benefits. The bill improves on the former bike commuter benefit originally passed in 2009, and suspended in the Tax Cut and Jobs Act of 2018.

The changes in the Bicycle Commuter Act of 2019 will make the benefit easier to use and more attractive for both employers and employees. An increased use of the benefit will both reduce transportation costs for employees and employers, and for the federal treasury.

What it does »

HR 1507, the Bicycle Commuter Act of 2019 will:

- » Reinstates the bike commuter benefit and extend that benefit to commuters using bikeshare and electric bikes.
- » Allow employees to use up to 20 percent of the parking benefit for bicycling expenses, so that employees can use the benefit in combination with the parking and transit benefit. This gives commuters more freedom to combine transportation modes.
- » Simplify the administration of the bike commuter benefit, allowing employees to use the benefit pre-tax, and saves employers from having to collect and record receipts.

Why it matters »

In 2017 the U.S. Department of Transportation released performance measures requiring states to set congestion mitigation and air quality goals for shifting transportation trips away from single occupancy motor vehicles. Offering incentives for employees to bike to work some or all of the time will help states meet these goals.

Investing in and encouraging bicycling can decrease congestion. A 2015 Report by Resources for the Future found that Capital Bikeshare cut neighborhood traffic congestion by 2-3% in Washington DC neighborhoods. A small change in traffic volumes, on the order of 2-3%, can result in significant decreases in congestion. Data from INRIX, a leading traffic analytics company, found that a 4% decrease in traffic volumes between 2007 and 2008, led to a nearly 30% decrease in traffic congestion nationwide.

Investing in and encouraging bicycling can improve air quality. According to the Environmental Protection Agency, transportation overtook power generation as the largest producer of greenhouse gas emissions in 2017. Bicycling is a GHG emission free mode of travel and multiple bikeshare systems have seen users report that they use bikeshare instead of a motor vehicle for trips, often in congested downtown areas.

The COMMUTE Act, H.R. 1517

Background »

H.R. 1517: The COMMUTE Act creates a pilot project to supply states and local governments with access data to help better plan transportation networks and connect residents with every day destinations- such as jobs schools, health care and grocery stores.

The U.S. Department of Transportation already supplies states with ^{freedom} congestion data, which measure how existing roads function. Until recently it has been difficult to analyze the cost-benefit of new projects based on improved access.

PILOT

Today, the private sector offers these tools, and a few states are using it already. However the data is expensive and not available to everyone. The Transportation Access and System Connection Act creates a pilot project to make that data available to 5 States, 10 metropolitan areas, and 5 rural areas to test how that data can be used to optimize transportation systems across modes and communities.

What it does »

- » Creates a pilot program to supply access data to five states, ten metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs), and five rural areas. The data will be provided using all transportation modes- biking, walking, transit and driving.
- » The U.S. DOT will provide a data set for each area that measures accessibility. Each state will share that data with its local governments and researchers. The funding for the pilot program comes from US DOT administrative funds.
- » The States and MPOs will use the data and report back to the U.S. DOT how the data is used, and highlight how such data impacted transportation investments. U.S. DOT will report results back to Congress.

Why it matters »

- » The basic function of our transportation system is to connect people to destinations. We need a better way to measure how well our system does this- for all modes and all people.
- » Funding for transportation is limited, and ensuring we are connecting as many people as possible to their daily destinations across modes will optimize our investments.
- » This data provides information about all the trips people take- not just their commute to work. That will improve our planning process, and ensure we build communities and transportation systems that work for everyone.

Why use Accessibility Data?

(Analysis done by State Smart Transportation Initiative)

Why » Accessibility data allows communities and planners to measure how well transportation projects will improve connectivity between residents and daily destinations such as work, schools, health care and grocery stores. Here's an example of how it was used in Madison, WI to understand the benefit of providing bike access U.S. Route 12/18.

The Problem » Residents that live north of Route 12/18 do not have safe bicycling or walking access to the areas south of Route 12/18, which offers many jobs and services. Improving connections opens opportunities for residents and for businesses.

The Model » This model uses Sugar Access² data on the number of households and destinations, and makes the following example:

- » Assumes nearby highway interchanges are not safely "bikeable."
- » Assumes an average bicycling speed of 8.5 MPH
- » Takes into account biking conditions on roads such as traffic speed, number of lanes and type of roads

Results » The accessibility analysis shows that 5,692 households gain access to shops, jobs and other opportunities south of the Beltline Highway within a 15-minute bike ride.

The accessibility analysis shows that 21,105 households gain access to shops, jobs and other opportunities south of the Beltline Highway within a 30-minute bike ride.

Improving Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety

The Problem »

Today, nearly 1 in 5 people who die in traffic crashes are pedestrians and bicyclists. Both the number of vulnerable road user fatalities and the percentage of overall roadway fatalities who are pedestrians and bicyclists continue to rise.

Even as that number increases, states spend less than 1 percent of their Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) on vulnerable road user safety. We believe this needs to change.

The Problem Can Be Solved »

We know how to make our roads safer:

The Federal Highway Administration has identified and tested proven safety countermeasures that are known to reduce pedestrian fatalities, and will help bicyclists safety too. These include road diets, leading pedestrian intervals, local road safety plans, medians, crosswalks, and more.

If we know how to improve safety, why aren't the dollars being spent?

State DOTs often use data-driven methods that were created to identify 'hot spots' rather than systemic transportation safety issues. This can lead to dangerous conditions, such as high speed arterial roads with limited crosswalks, sidewalks, and bikeways, not being identified as dangerous because crashes and fatalities do not fit the patterns that the data-driven method prioritizes.

The Solution »

H
Congress should create a special rule for HSIP that ensures that data-driven decisions lead to funding for vulnerable user safety where aggregate data suggests there is a safety need.

In the past, Congress has implemented special rules in HSIP for High Risk Rural Roads, and for Older Drivers and Pedestrians, where Congress identified a gap in safety improvements.

Now we need a special rule for vulnerable road users within HSIP which states that if a metropolitan area, rural planning area or tribal land has a vulnerable road user fatality rate higher than 1.5 persons per 100,000 population for two years or more, then the state must use some of its HSIP funding to prevent vulnerable road user fatalities in that area.

This would provide an incentive to states to ensure that their data-driven methods capture vulnerable road user fatalities and that they work with local governments to make improvements where vulnerable road user fatalities are common.

How You Can Help »

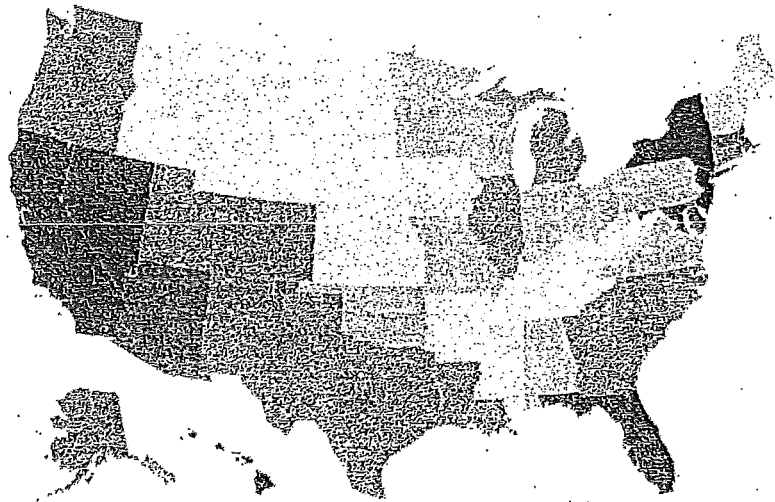

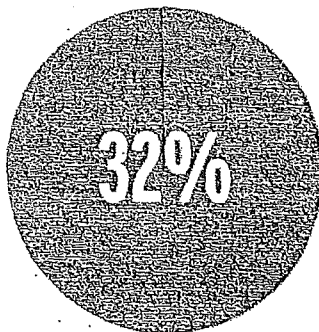
What is the Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside?

The 2015 FAST Act requires states to publicly report data about their transportation alternatives* application process. 2016 was the first year states reported the following data; the number of applications they received for transportation alternative projects, the aggregate cost of those applications, and the number of projects they funded, and the aggregate cost of projects funded (total and by project eligibility).

Since this data has been reported, the percentage of unfunded projects has increased each year. The cost of unfunded projects has also increased - more than \$300 million in the last year alone.

The national total authorization for TA was \$850 million in FY 2019.

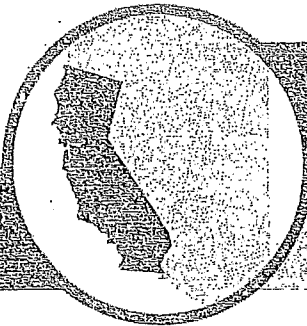

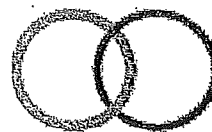
California's bicycling to work data remarkably mirrors the Western regional average over the last ten years.

Where California really separates itself and shows promise is its recent use of federal funding for bicycling and walking.

After a widely publicized external audit of the CalTrans published by the State Smart Transportation Initiative in 2014, the state began an upward trend in the percent of federal funding spent on bicycling and walking. In 2013 and 2014, California essentially matched the national average rate of spending on bicycling and walking, but in each of the last three fiscal years that rate has increased - reaching a 10 year high in fiscal year 2017.

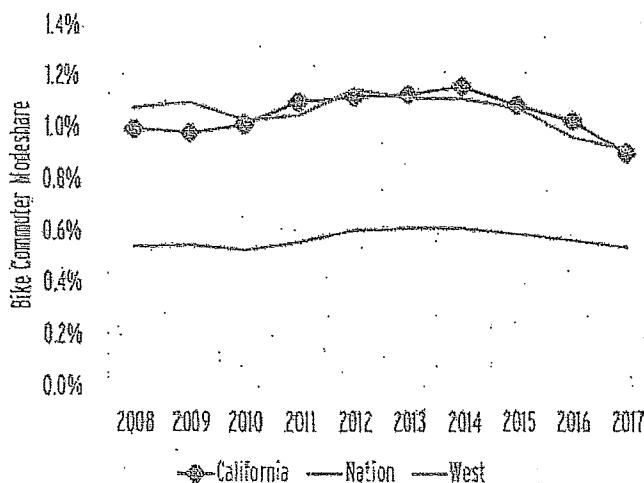

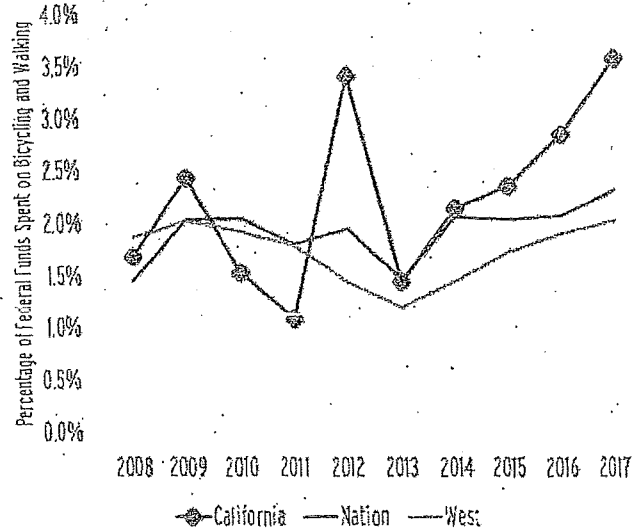
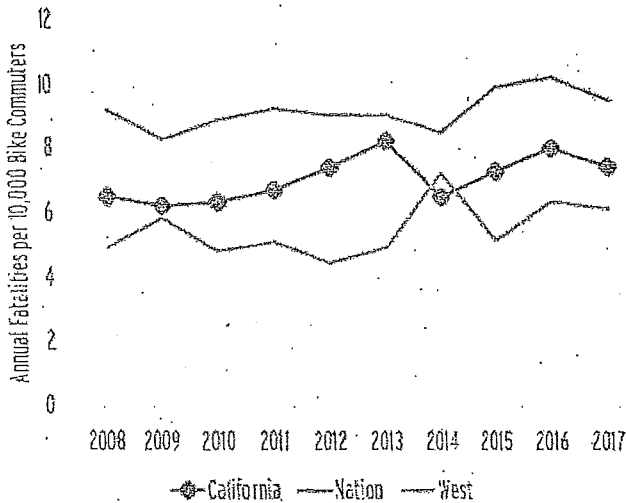

Featured Agency - CalTrans (Agency did not respond)

Caltrans has had an open and productive engagement with active transportation in recent years.

In 2014, a report by the State Smart Transportation Initiative that was commissioned by Governor Jerry Brown and California Transportation Secretary Brian Kelly pointed out many issues with bicycle planning in California. This included findings that "Caltrans' peculiar standards on bicycle facilities even pertain to locally owned streets, precluding some active transportation initiatives," and that "[t]he agency and department should support, or propose if no bill is forthcoming, legislation to end the archaic practice of imposing state rules on local streets for bicycle facilities." This recommendation came to fruition in the Protected Bikeways Act of 2014, which created Class IV Bikeways for the state of California - allowing the spread of separated bike lanes in the state.

In 2015, these efforts were aligned with the Caltrans Strategic Management Plan which called for a tripling of bicycle trips between 2015 and 2020 and a 10% reduction in the number of bicyclist fatalities.

In 2017, California adopted its first statewide bicycle and pedestrian plan, "Toward an Active California" to support those goals.

Altogether, these actions show a procedural and interlocking set of changes in California setting the stage for continued improvements.



The Golden Gate Bridge, Highway and Transportation District consists of nineteen (19) Directors, as follows:

- > The City and County of San Francisco is represented by nine (9) Directors:
 - The Board of Supervisors appoints eight (8) Directors:
 - * Four (4) of whom must be elected members of the Board of Supervisors; and
 - * Four (4) of whom must be members of the public-at-large.
 - The Mayor appoints one (1) Director.

The Board of Supervisors eight appointments are subject to review and affirmation by the Board of Supervisors in January of each odd numbered year (two year terms). Once the Board of Supervisors approves the Motion appointing members to the District, a certified copy of the Motion shall immediately forwarded to the Department of Transportation.

The composition of the other members are as follows:

- > One (1) Director representing Del Norte County, one (1) Director representing Mendocino County, and one (1) Director representing Napa County, appointed by the Board of Supervisors of the respective represented county.
- > Four (4) Directors representing Marin County, appointed by the Board of Supervisors thereof.

Two (2) of the Directors shall be an elected member of the Board of Supervisors, one (1) Director shall be an elected member of a city council of a city within Marin County and designated by the Marin Council of Mayors and Councilmen, and one (1) Director shall be a member of the public-at -large.

> Three (3) Directors representing Sonoma County and appointed by the Board of Supervisors thereof. One (1) Director shall be an elected member of the Board of Supervisors, one (1) Director shall be an elected member of a city council of a city within Sonoma County and designated by the Mayors' and Councilmen's Association of Sonoma County, and one (1) Director shall be a member of the public-at-large.

The Board shall be the governing body of the District and shall outline rules of policy, approve plans, and vote or withhold appropriations to carry the same into effect. The powers and duties of the District are stated in California Streets and Highways Code, Sections 27160 et seq.

Compensated. Members are each paid \$50.00 per meeting day for attending meeting of the board and committee meeting on different days, but no member shall receive such compensation in excess of \$5,000 in any one year; except the president who shall receive compensation not to exceed \$7,500 in any one year. Each member of the board shall receive a sum equal to the necessary traveling expenses incurred by him/her in the performance of his/her duties.
