4	authority for the Department of Human Services to continue its membership in the 18

6	Agency to execute the necessary agreements for participation in the consortium's
7	continued development, implementation, maintenance and operation of a computer
8	system for the administration of public benefit programs in accordance with State
9	requirements. This resolution will expand the expenditure authority from \$29,419,538
10	for an additional amount of \$13,110,600 from July 1, 2010, through July 31, 2013. The
11	total project budget including this extension is \$42,530,138. Please note: State and
12	Federal reimbursement is at 92% of \$42,530,138. County general fund portion is
13	\$3,402,241 from 1999 through 2013. The County general fund portion for the extension
14	period is \$1,048,848.
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16	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco wishes to continue to participate in the
17	CalWIN automated public benefits distribution and reporting system in accordance with State
18	requirements.
19	WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors originally authorized San Francisco's participation
20	in this 18 county consortium on December 6th of 1999 Resolution No. 1094-99 for the
21	replacement of the Welfare Client Data System (WCDS) with the new CalWIN system.
22	WHEREAS, The Federal and State funding agencies have granted a contract extension of
23	the existing contract with Electronic Data Systems through July 31, 2013. Electronic Data
24	Systems is the state wide contractor developing and implementing the CalWIN system.
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1	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Human Services
2	Agency to continue its membership in the 18 County CalWIN Consortium and authorizes the
3	Director of the Human Services Agency to execute the necessary agreements for participation
4	in the consortium's continued development, implementation, maintenance and operation of a
5	computer system for the administration of public benefit programs in accordance with state
6	requirements.
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
