Dear Supervisor Peskin & Staff,

We would like to meet with you in order to get on the same page with regard to our pending Type 42 Dept. of ABC license application for the Museum of Ice Cream.

From what we understand (and please let us know if we're missing anything) your primary concerns were in our hours, security, and general details of our operations. We hope this letter provides some information that we can go over in person at your earliest convenience. We are getting close to being ready to open and want to make sure our operation plans for the space are suitable.

This adult-only space requires ID checks for all guests entering the mezzanine. Staff security will be stationed at the base of the stairwell leading to the wine bar area. Staff are clearly identifiable by their brightly colored and marked uniforms. At all times that guests are in the store/entry area as well as the mezzanine, they are visible to our staff.

We've adjusted our requested hours on our ABC application to be 11am – midnight (Sun – Wed) and 11am – 1am (Thur - Sat) to hopefully address your concern for morning intoxication on the streets of District 3. We anticipate closing well before midnight most nights as many of our staff rely on BART to get home. We will send over a copy of these signed conditions once we receive them from Dept. of ABC.

We are asking for the later hour to accommodate special events and fundraisers that we are known for hosting. We have hosted numerous events for the city including the launch of Small Business Saturday with Mayor Ed Lee, fundraising events for Creative Growth in Oakland, Downtown Streets Teams, a Voting Initiative with Mayor Breed, amongst many others in the bay. In total, we have donated over \$250,000 to nonprofits since we opened in 2017.

The mezzanine will be staffed by 3-5 employees per shift, so there will be ample monitoring of patrons and beverages. Misbehaving clientele are not our typical parent and tourist audience but if they appear will be quickly addressed and never over-served as the mezzanine space is visually open to the first floor and that would negatively impact the mood of the whole premises and materially harm our family friendly Museum. Maintaining a positive, fun environment for everyone is a top priority. Museum guests can stop in before or after their tour and it is open to the public, just like our gift shop. We anticipate our busiest hours will be 3-8pm.

in terms of exterior security, we have some unique needs based on our popularity and our location. As you may have seen, our tickets sell out quickly and queues form around the block from Grant Street to O'Farrell. This has been the case in our New York City and Los Angeles locations as well. We have a system of staff monitoring this space and keeping the energy positive so guests are in a good mood when they enter the space and a good mood when they leave. We also feel that having this option for guests will reduce the number of people waiting outside.

Museum of Ice Cream is reaching out to inform you of our application for an On-Sale Beer & Wine Public Premises (Type 42 ABC License) to expand our services to offer beer and wine on our mezzanine, a designated and separate space within our Museum (see diagram).

We are constituents of District 3 within Supervisor Peskin's district. We wanted to introduce ourselves to you in advance of the committee meeting to provide time to address any concerns you may have. We have met with Erin Lundy of Chair Mandelman's office and are reaching out to Supervisor Stefani as well.

When we opened our doors in September 2017, we never thought that our small idea would be embraced so widely in the Bay Area and that we would be able to bring the magic of ice cream and community to over 600,000 museum goers permanently. We also recognize that it is through the City's support that we can continue to do our work here in San Francisco.

As we look to our future, we believe this license will provide patrons with a 'taste' of what the MOIC adventure does entail, whether or not they have purchased tickets. It adds another opportunity for us to innovate on our mission. It also serves as a downtown catchpoint for tourists and locals to spend their day.

One main concern by Supervisor Peskin's office is how we intend to distinguish this adult-only space from the youthful spirit of our museum experience. ID checks will be held at all times the bar area (on a separate floor) is open. This is the only area where alcohol can be served or consumed, as you can see the attached diagram showing the layout. Nobody is walking around the museum with alcohol.

There will be staff stationed at the downstairs door that leads to the stairs. Our staff members are easily recognizable to customers, we wear brightly colored uniforms with name tags and direct guests through the museum spaces like tour guides. The mezzanine will be staffed by 3-5 employees per shift, so there will be ample monitoring of patrons and beverages. Misbehaving clientele will be quickly addressed as the mezzanine space is visually open to the first floor and that would negatively impact the mood of the whole premises. Maintaining a positive, fun environment for everyone is a top priority.





Though there is always a crowd to manage, we generally find that the type of person interested in coming to an experience like ours is willing to follow the rules and maintain good behavior. Our whole intent with this undertaking is to make people happy, and our guests generally leave in that state of mind. If anything, we feel we're putting people who visit us back into the world a little better than they started that day.

We feel our project meets Public Convenience as there are many people who come to this area with the express intention of visiting the Museum of Ice Cream. It seems reasonable that we have a robust experience for them to brave driving and parking or transiting into the city, often with children. As mentioned by Supervisor Ronen at the full board meeting where this item was first under review, many parents will really appreciate having the opportunity to get a glass of wine after a day with kids. We think helping parents relax is a public convenience (and one might argue necessity) all on its own.

We want to add this adult experience to cater better to the families and groups that spend their day with us. We are consistently innovating to improve our experience and help people connect-- in person, offline, and in a joyful way. Our application with the Department of ABC requests the following hours (11:00 am - 12:00 am Sun - Thurs and 11:00 am - 1:00 am Fri -Sat). Museum guests can stop in before or after their tour and it is open to the public, just like our gift shop. We have amended our requested hours at the request of Supervisor Peskin and anticipate our busiest hours will be 3-8pm.

We've done many community-oriented events and work closely with Union Square BID, Downtown Streets Team, Immersive Design Summit, Contemporary Jewish Museum, ACT, among others, and we were a voter registration location prior to the midterm elections with an event hosted by Mayor London Breed.

We have toured the San Francisco Police Department's Alcohol Liaison Unit through the space and they approve our application with the attached restrictions, including hourly restrictions and no "to go" sales permitted.

We ask for your support in approving our request for Public Convenience or Necessity at the upcoming PSNS Committee Meeting. We are always learning how to be better neighbors and constituents in this beautiful city and thank you for the opportunity to develop our brand here.
