Residential Burglary (PC 459 1st Degree)



Residential Burglary- PC 459/460

- PC 459: Every person who enters any house, room, apartment, [...], shop, warehouse, store, [...], vehicle as defined by the Vehicle Code, when the doors are locked, [...], with intent to commit grand or petit larceny or any felony is guilty of burglary.
- PC 460 (a): Every burglary of an inhabited dwelling house[...] or the inhabited portion of any other building, is burglary of the first degree.
 (b) All other kinds of burglary are of the second degree.



Larceny/Theft

- Package Theft is generally either petty or grand theft, depending on the value
- Petty Theft (PC 484/488): Value under \$950
- Grand Theft (PC 487): Value exceeding \$950
- In 2018, there were over 16,000 thefts in San Francisco
- Theft is down 14% YTD compared to 2018


Residential Burglary Hot Spots







- Residential burglary filing rate 86%, action taken rate 92%
- SFDA: Increasing caseload of residential burglary cases
- 2018 Conviction Rate: 88%
