Resolution approving the FY2019-2020 Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS ("HOPWA") Program; and authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, to apply for, accept, and expend the City's FY2019-2020 HOPWA Program entitlement from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development in the amount of \$7,520,360 and to expend program income of \$50,000 for a combined total of \$7,570,360 for the period of July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2024.

WHEREAS, Under the AIDS Housing Opportunity Act, Subtitle D of Title VIII of the National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, Public Law Number 101-625, the City and County of San Francisco is eligible to apply for and receive funds from the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) Program; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving approximately \$7,520,360 in FY2019-2020 HOPWA Program funds from HUD and has approximately \$50,000 in anticipated Program Income, for a combined total of approximately \$7,570,360; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is responsible for distributing a portion of the HOPWA funds to the County of San Mateo as the lead agency for the San Francisco Eligible Metropolitan Statistical Area (EMSA); and

WHEREAS, The Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD) has prepared programs and a proposed Expenditure Schedule for FY2019-2020 HOPWA funding, including the distributions to the County of San Mateo, a copy of which is located in Clerk of the Board of Supervisors File No. ______ (the "Expenditure Schedule"); and
