WHEREAS, In 2012, the City of San Francisco, San Francisco Unified School District and the Mission Economic Development Agency (MEDA) joined efforts with more than 20 citywide and youth-serving community partners to launch Mission Promise Neighborhood (MPN) as an urgent response to bridge family economic security with student academic achievement in the Latino community; and

WHEREAS, MPN is a community effort based at nine San Francisco Unified School District schools and three family resource centers that connects thousands of families to services for infants, children and adults in the Mission District of San Francisco, including child care, preschool, health care, housing, tax preparation, immigration assistance, financial coaching, job training and more; and

WHEREAS, In its seventh year of implementation and in alignment with citywide strategic goals, MPN has seen impressive outcomes for children and youth, such as increased graduation rates, significant gains in kindergarten-readiness, and improved service-delivery and accountability through data-sharing agreements and a shared referral database; and

WHEREAS, These outcomes are even more impressive considering the extreme pressures Mission Promise Neighborhood families are experiencing, including unprecedented levels of housing displacement and growing income inequality, coupled with a national political climate translating to an assault on their community; and

WHEREAS, California currently has five Promise Neighborhoods, including MPN in San Francisco, YPI in Los Angeles, Chula Vista/San Diego Promise, Hayward Promise, and Corning Promise, each achieving impressive academic outcomes; and

WHEREAS, Promise Neighborhoods are community-based provider networks with a common agenda, shared measurement systems, mutually reinforcing activities, continuous communication, and a backbone organization, leading to cradle-to-college-to-career wraparound supports and communities of opportunity for children and families; and
