23	Be it ordai	ned by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:	
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1	Section 1. <u>The original version of this ordinance added new Administrative Code</u>
2	Chapter 119, requiring the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing to: 1)
3	establish a Safe Overnight Parking Pilot Program to provide eligible vehicularly homeless
4	persons a place to park and sleep in their vehicles overnight, case management, and other
5	services, and 2) collaborate with the Municipal Transportation Agency to develop an On-
6	Street Parking Citation and Tow- and-Storage-Fee Abatement Program to provide eligible
7	vehicularly homeless persons with waivers of parking fines and fees. The Board added
8	Chapter 119 in Ordinance No. 082-19, and duplicated the file. Because Chapter 119 has
9	already been enacted, it has been removed from this duplicate ordinance, except for
10	subsection (d) of Section 119.5, which is amended herein.
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12	Section 2. Chapter 119 of the Administrative Code is amended by revising Section
13	119.5 to read as follows:
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15	SEC 119.5. ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLEMENTATION.
16	* * *
17	(d) The ControllerHSH shall track and evaluate the Overnight Safe Overnight Parking
18	Pilot Program's outcomes. Not more than six months after the effective date of Chapter 119,
19	and every six months thereafter, HSH shall report key information to the Board of Supervisors,
20	including but not limited to the number of Program Participants served by the Vehicle
21	Navigation Triage Center and Safe Parking Lot(s); Program Participants' lengths of stay; and
22	Program Participants' destinations upon exit (e.g., permanent housing, transitional housing).
23	The Controller shall summarize these outcomes in a report to be submitted to the Board of
24	Supervisors no later than six months after the effective date of this Chapter 119, and every six
25	months thereafter, until such time as the Pilot Program is no longer in operation. Within one

1	<u>year of the effective date of this Chapter 119, HSH and the Controller shall jointly, in</u>
2	consultation with the Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing,
3	shall submit to the Board of Supervisors a report that summarizes these statistics and
4	describes any lessons learned from the operation of the Overnight Safe Overnight Parking
5	Pilot Program, and makes recommendations as to how and whether the Program should be
6	continued, along with a proposed resolution to accept the report.
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8	Section 3. Article 1.1 of the Police Code shall be amended by revising Section 97.1 to
9	read as follows:
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11	SEC. 97.1. EXCEPTION <u>S</u> .
12	(a) The General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department may by written
13	permit allow the use or occupancy of any house car, camper or trailer coach on or in any
14	property under the jurisdiction of the Recreation and Park Commission when he finds that
15	such use is necessary for the operation and protection of City property and livestock.
16	The permission granted by the General Manager may be revoked upon five days
17	written notice to the permittee.
18	(b) Persons who have been given a license by the City to park and sleep in their
19	vehicle at a Safe Overnight Parking Lot or a Vehicle Navigation Triage Center in accordance
20	with Administrative Code Chapter 119 shall not be subject to the penalties set forth in Section
21	98 of this Article 1.1 while using or occupying their vehicle for human habitation, provided that
22	such use or occupancy occurs on the premises of the Safe Overnight Parking Lot or Vehicle
23	Navigation Triage Center to which they have been given a license.
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1	Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after		
2	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the		
3	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board		
4	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
