

1 [Fire Code - Fire Department Fee Amendment]

3 **Ordinance amending the Fire Code to increase fees for certain Fire Department**
 4 **services; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California**
 5 **Environmental Quality Act.**

11 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

12

13 Section 1. Environmental Findings. The Planning Department has determined that the
 14 actions contemplated in this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act
 15 (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with
 16 the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 190627 and is incorporated herein by
 17 reference. The Board affirms this determination.

18

19 Section 2. The Fire Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 113.2, 113.4, 113.5,
 20 113.6, 113.7, 113.8, 113.9, 113.10, 113.12, and 113.21, to read as follows:

21

22 **113.2. [For SF] Operational Permit Filing Fees.**

23 The filing fee for operational permits is set forth in Table 113-A. Inspections
 24 necessary for permit issuance that require more than two hours to complete shall be subject
 25 to an additional fee of ~~\$125~~\$130 for each hour or fraction thereof. The Fire Department shall

1 not issue a permit until the fees are paid.

2
3 **113.4. [For SF] Plan Review Fees.**

4 Upon application for a permit for the erection of a new building or for alteration work
5 for which plans are required by the Department of Building Inspection, the Central Permit
6 Bureau shall charge and collect a fee to compensate the Fire Department for its costs of
7 reviewing plans submitted with building permit applications for compliance with fire safety
8 regulations. The fee shall be based on the valuation of the work as determined by the
9 Department of Building Inspection. The fee for each permit is set in Table 113-B. The Fire
10 Department shall assess a fee in the amount of ~~\$125~~\$130 per hour or fraction thereof to review
11 revisions to any previously approved plans. The Central Permit Bureau shall collect the fee
12 before issuing the permit.

13
14 **113.5. [For SF] Field Inspection Fees.**

15 When the Fire Department determines a field inspection is required to verify that
16 building construction is in compliance with fire safety regulations and this code, it shall notate
17 the application accordingly to provide notice to the Central Permit Bureau. The Central Permit
18 Bureau shall collect the inspection fee due, before issuing a building permit. The fee for each
19 permit is set in Table 113-C. Initial field inspection fees will be charged for inspections of new
20 fire alarm, sprinkler, and gaseous suppression systems per the notation in Table 113-C.

21 After building permit issuance, when the fire code official notifies the applicant that
22 additional inspection time is required over the amount of time set in Table 113-C, the applicant
23 shall purchase additional inspection time before the inspector schedules additional
24 inspections. The Fire Department shall collect a fee of ~~\$125~~\$130 per hour or fraction thereof
25 for the cost of providing the inspection service.

1
2 **113.6. [For SF] Pre-Application Plan Review.**

3 When an applicant wishes to discuss specific design issues or submit preliminary
4 designs for review and comment by the Fire Department before the applicant submits a formal
5 application for permit, the Fire Department shall assess a fee of ~~\$375~~\$390. This fee provides
6 the applicant with up to two hours total for research and meeting with Fire Department
7 personnel. When the time spent by the Fire Department exceeds two hours, the Department
8 shall assess additional fees at the rate of ~~\$125~~\$130 per hour or fraction thereof.

9
10 **113.7. [For SF] Re-Inspection of Violation Fees.**

11 If the fire code official issues a notice of violation under this code, the notice of
12 violation may set a period of time that is reasonable to remedy the violation and the fire code
13 official may re-inspect the property to verify that the person responsible has made the
14 required correction. The Fire Department shall collect a fee in the amount of ~~\$250~~\$260 for re-
15 inspections. If the time required for the re-inspection exceeds one hour, the Fire Department
16 shall assess an additional fee at the rate of ~~\$125~~\$130 per hour or fraction thereof.

17
18 **113.8. [For SF] High-Rise Inspection Fees.**

19 For inspections of high-rise structures pursuant to Section 13217 of the California
20 Health and Safety Code, the owner of the structure shall pay a fee to cover the Fire
21 Department's costs of inspection. The Department shall calculate the fee on the basis of
22 ~~\$13~~\$13.50 per 1000 square feet of gross floor area.

23
24 **113.9. [For SF] Referral Fees.**

1 If a government agency requests a preliminary site inspection or survey of premises
2 for compliance with this code or other regulatory codes enforced by the Fire Department, the
3 Fire Department shall collect a service fee of ~~\$125~~\$130 per hour or fraction thereof for the on-
4 site inspections and consultations. When the referral inspection is requested by another San
5 Francisco agency, the requesting agency shall transfer the fee to the Fire Department through
6 electronic transfer. The requesting agency shall pay the fee before scheduling the inspection
7 or consultation. Fees referenced in the California Health and Safety Code take precedence
8 over this fee.

9
10 **113.10. [For SF] Overtime Fee.**

11 If a person requests an inspection or other service that requires the assigned Fire
12 Department employee to work outside of the employee's normal working schedule, the
13 Department will charge an overtime fee of ~~\$136~~\$143 per hour or fraction thereof. The person
14 requesting the services shall pay the fee before the inspection or other service is performed.
15 The minimum compensation is four hours.

16
17 **113.12. [For SF] Water Flow Request Fee.**

18 Upon a request from a person for water flow information, the Department will charge
19 a water flow fee of ~~\$125~~\$130. If the information requested requires that Fire Department
20 employees perform an on-site water flow test, the Department will charge a fee of \$250.

21
22 **113.21. [For SF] Fee-setting procedure.**

23 (a) No later than a date that the Controller shall prescribe, the Chief of the Department
24 shall annually report the revenues received from each type of fee the Department collects.
25 The report shall include the costs, both direct and indirect, the Department incurs in providing

1 the services for which each fee is assessed, the anticipated costs for the ensuing fiscal year,
2 the level of service the Department anticipates it will provide for each service for which it
3 charges a fee, and the rate that would be necessary to support each service. The Controller
4 shall file the report with the Board of Supervisors no later than July 1 of each year. If the fees
5 are insufficient to recover SFFD costs, or if the fee recovers more than the actual costs, the
6 Controller shall submit legislation to the Board of Supervisors to ensure that over time the City
7 fees do not exceed the cost of providing the service for which the City charges the fee. The
8 amount of the license fee for the Fire Department permit for the ~~2017-2018~~2019-2020 fiscal
9 year shall be as set forth in the Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 75 et seq.

10 (b) Beginning with the set of fees for fiscal year 2019-2020, and each fiscal year thereafter, the
11 Controller shall annually adjust the Department's fees as provided in this section to the extent
12 necessary to ensure that over time each departmental fee does not exceed the cost of providing the
13 service for which the City charges the fee. This process will occur as follows. The Chief of the
14 Department shall annually report to the Controller the revenues received from each type of fee the
15 Department collects for the immediately preceding year. The report shall include the costs, both direct
16 and indirect, the Department incurred in providing the services for which each fee is assessed, the
17 anticipated costs for the ensuing fiscal year, the level of service the Department anticipates it will
18 provide for each service for which it charges a fee, and the rate that would be necessary to support
19 each service. No later than April 15 of each year, the Chief of Department shall submit this report and
20 SFFD's current fee schedule to the Controller. No later than July 1 of each year, the Controller shall
21 make such adjustments to the fees as are necessary to comply with this ordinance and file a report with
22 the Board of Supervisors reporting the new fee schedule as adjusted under this ordinance and
23 certifying that: (1) each will produce sufficient revenue to support the costs of providing the services
24 for which the fee is charged and (2) each fee will not produce revenue that exceeds the costs of
25 providing the services for which each permit fee is charged. No later than September of each year,

SFFD's fee schedule showing the current fee amounts inclusive of annual adjustments shall be published in an Appendix to the Fire Code, posted on SFFD's website, and made available upon request at SFFD headquarters.

1 This initial minimum inspection fee covers all inspections up to the hours specified
2 above. If the inspections for the new system exceed the hours specified above, additional
3 hourly fees will be assessed.

4
5 Section 3. Effective and Operative Dates. This ordinance shall become effective 30
6 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor
7 returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it,
8 or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor’s veto of the ordinance. This ordinance shall
9 become operative on the latter of its effective date or July 1, 2019.

10
11 Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
12 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
13 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
14 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
15 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the “Note” that appears under
16 the official title of the ordinance.
