Overview

- The Public Works Mutual Aid Agreement was established in October 1989.
- Intended as a means for public works agencies to receive mutual aid quickly following a catastrophic disaster, such as a large earthquake.





Signatories

 19 counties and 155 cities throughout the State of California have become parties to the Agreement, including Marin County and Solano County





Procedures

- Member agencies are under no obligation to provide or exhaust their own resources. Assistance is voluntary.
- Requesting agencies are required to fully reimburse the assistance provided by the member agencies.
 The cost incurred may be reimbursable by FEMA.
- In order to request mutual aid, a local emergency proclamation is required.





Public Works Emergency Response Role

- Clearing debris
- Assessing and inspecting damaged buildings and structures
- Conducting emergency repairs on the City's infrastructure
