| 15 | Section 1. General Findings: | | |
| 16 | (a) | The San Fra | ancisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) desires to implement |
| 17 | an Advanced Meter Infrastructure System (AMI System) to collect hourly consumption data | | |
| 18 | from its retail water customers so that it can more efficiently manage its water resources and | | |
| 19 | water system assets in San Francisco, and provide enhanced service to residential and | | |
| 20 | commercial customers. | | |
| 21 | (b) | On June 10 | , 2008, the SFPUC advertised a Request for Proposals seeking |
| 22 | proposals from qualified AMI contractors. The Request for Proposals provided that proposals | | |
| 23 | from AMI contractors would be evaluated based on experience, qualifications and cost. | | |
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(c) The Director of the Human Rights Commission waived the requirement for an
 LBE sub-contracting goal for this project in accordance with Section 14.B.8 of the
 Administrative Code.

4 (d) On August 13, 2008, the SFPUC received proposals from three qualified 5 proposers.

6 (e) On February 13, 2009, the SFPUC announced that VSI Meter Services, Inc. was
7 the highest-ranked proposer.

8 (f) Section 21.4 of the Administrative Code authorizes departments to negotiate 9 contract terms and conditions, including price, with the highest-ranked proposer.

10 (g) On March 10, 2009, the SFPUC, by Resolution No. 09-0046, approved the 11 selection of VSI Meter Services, Inc. to provide specialized procurement and implementation 12 of an AMI System; and authorized the General Manager of the SFPUC to negotiate an 13 agreement with VSI Meter Services, Inc. for a maximum amount of \$62,822,980, or, in the 14 event negotiations were not successful or City requirements were not satisfied, to negotiate 15 an agreement with the next highest-ranked proposer.

(h) The SFPUC has negotiated an Agreement for Procurement, Installation and
Implementation of Advanced Meter Infrastructure System with VSI Meter Services, Inc. (VSI
Agreement). The proposed VSI Agreement, including all appendices, is on file with the Clerk
of the Board of Supervisors in File No. _____, and is hereby declared to be a part of this
Ordinance as if set forth fully herein.

21 (i) The VSI Agreement specifies a contract not-to-exceed amount of \$62,531,370
22 and an installation term of 27 months.

(j) Under the VSI Agreement, the SFPUC will enter into a separate software license
 agreement with Aclara RF Systems Inc., a subcontractor to VSI Meter Services, Inc., for an

amount not to exceed \$228,610. The proposed software license agreement is attached to the
 VSI Agreement in appendix I.

3 (k) Under the VSI Agreement, the SFPUC will enter into a separate software
4 maintenance agreement with Aclara RF Systems, Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$60,000
5 and a term of 24 months, with options to renew the agreement at the sole and absolute
6 discretion of the City for a term of up to 20 years. The proposed software maintenance
7 agreement is attached to the VSI Agreement in appendix I.

8 (I) Under the VSI Agreement, the SFPUC will enter into a source code escrow 9 agreement with Aclara RF Systems, Inc. and U.S. Bank National Association for an amount 10 not to exceed \$3,000 and a term of 24 months, with options to renew the agreement for 11 \$1,500/year at the sole and absolute discretion of the City for a term of up to 20 years. The 12 proposed escrow agreement is attached to the VSI Agreement in appendix J.

(m) The SFPUC anticipates that installation of the AMI System will begin in
November 2009 and end in February 2012.

(n) On July 27, 2009, the City Planning Department issued a final Certificate of
Determination/Exemption from Environmental Review for the project. The City Planning
Department found that the project is exempt from environmental review under the California
Environmental Quality Act. A copy of the Certificate of Determination is on file with the Clerk
of the Board of Supervisors in File No. _____, and is hereby declared to be part of this
Ordinance as if set forth fully herein.

(o) The City Planning Department has reviewed the project and found that it is
consistent with the City's General Plan and with the priority policies in Planning Code Section
101.1. The Planning Department's review and findings are on file with the Clerk of the Board
of Supervisors in File No. ______, and are hereby declared to be part of this Ordinance
as if set forth fully herein.

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Section 2. Approvals and Ratification.

2 The Board of Supervisors, under Charter Section 9.118, hereby approves and (a) 3 authorizes the General Manager of the SFPUC to execute Water Enterprise Agreement No. 4 CS-936, Agreement for Procurement, Installation and Implementation of Advanced Meter 5 Infrastructure System, with VSI Meter Services, Inc., for an amount not to exceed 6 \$62,531,370, and the related agreements: (1) software license agreement with Aclara RF 7 Systems Inc., with a not-to-exceed amount of \$228,610, (2) software maintenance agreement 8 with Aclara RF Systems Inc., with a not-to-exceed amount of \$60,000 and a term of 24 9 months, with options to renew the agreement for up to 20 years, and (3) source code escrow 10 agreement with Aclara RF System Inc. and U.S. Bank National Association, with a not-to-11 exceed amount of \$3,000 and a term of 24 months, with options to renew the agreement for 12 \$1,500/year for up to 20 years, in substantially the forms on file with the Clerk of the Board, 13 and in such final forms as approved by the General Manager, the City Attorney, and the 14 Purchaser.

(b) The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the project is consistent with the
City's General Plan and with the priority policies in Planning Code Section 101.1, consistent
with the findings of the Planning Department, and for the reasons set forth by the Planning
Department which findings are on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No.
